
What is Accreditation?

Accredited public schools are dynamic learning communities where teachers, administrators, staff, students, and parents are committed to the ongoing pursuit of the highest quality education.





- The use of reflective practice by most teachers, and the maintenance of expertise in content areas and in content-specific instructional practices

Highlights of our Critical Strengths

- The use of a variety of interventions and services to identify and address student needs, employed by the support services teams
- The improved and positive climate among staff and students that is fostered by approachable and supportive leadership
- The involvement of the school community, including parents, teachers, outside organizations, and students, in participation and support of various academic and extracurricular activities

NFHS Critical Needs & Plans for Growth

- A process to complete the revision and implementation of the school-wide analytic rubrics to ensure that they are measurable, and are guiding instruction, curriculum, and assessment in every classroom, and are clearly communicated to all stakeholders
 - Developing portfolio and portfolio defense of Attributes of the Graduate
 - Aligning curriculum and instruction to Attributes of the Graduate
- Additional formal time to collaborate within and between departments to write curriculum for all courses, with a view towards increasing cross-curricular opportunities
 - Continuing to implement the curriculum development plan
 - Common planning time for course-based teams

NFHS Critical Needs & Plans for Growth

- A process to improve the Capstone program to ensure the development of strong interpersonal relationships between students and staff, and to effectively prepare students for their future endeavors
 - Implementation of Rebel 33 to provide all students with embedded time in the school day to get the support they need to be successful
- A process to improve communication and provide collaborative time between student support staff and the general faculty to promote overall cohesiveness and increase the effective implementation of modifications and accommodations
 - Dedicated time for collaboration at the beginning and throughout the school year to better address the needs of individual students
 - Professional learning for all faculty to support students with special needs

NFHS Critical Needs & Plans for Growth

- An evaluation of and update to the original portions of the facility, such as the auditorium and locker rooms, to ensure they meet all current federal and state regulations, and meet the learning needs and experiences of all students
 - Thank you to the Board of Education for supporting the RFQ for architectural and design work at the high school!
