Discussion occurred.

Mr. Kelly asked Ms. Mahoney if the Board could try this evaluation model without the 360 degree evaluation. Ms. Mahoney stated that she is willing to try this for a year. Ms. Mahoney asked Ms. Tyrer what they did in her previous district, she stated that they used the state school board association evaluation model.

Mr. Erlebach shared that this would be a good tool to protect the district and the superintendent as well. Mr. Erlebach stated that this year the cycle would be different because the cycle should begin in March.

Ms. Buckmaster stated that Mike Wantland is fantastic. He brings mass quantities of food to feed the students after practice, he volunteers at the food bank. It seems that every time we connect him with someone he brings more people to volunteer with him.

Stacey Dills stated that we have two Special Ed. instructional assistant openings, so if you know of anyone who wants a job have them contact her.

Ms. Woika spoke about the SHE warriors. They have 21 girls participating, six coaches, 3-4 moms running with them regularly. They usually have the Graveyard Dash out in Vernonia, that race would be on October 27th. They decided to cancel their away race so that Ms. Woika and other staff can attend Jim Mudd's memorial. She talked to Lynn Mudd, and they are going to have a Jim Mudd 5K

run on the beach. Jeremy Hill will mark the course with markers that have Jim's face on them. The date for this race was not announced.

Staff Input Continued

Ms. Nugent shared that they are really focusing on attendance, they have been creating incentives for students to be at school, and are working on attendance plans with other students.

Mr. Lawyer, shared that the win last Friday cannot be overstated enough. If you could have seen the faces of those boys. Jim Severson, Jon Welsh and Mr. Kelly, they pretty much wrote a check for that youth athletics program. It took seven years to see the fruit of their labors, but it was a great win.

Mr. Kelly asked Mr. Baertlein why we are going with plan B for the vehicle storage building. Mr. Baertlein stated that plan A was far to expensive. The bid was \$300,000 for a 2400 sq. ft. building. That amounts to \$125 per square foot. We budgeted \$80,000-\$100,000 for that building. Mr. Erlebach stated that the proposal is to use our existing building. We would remove the two batting cages and install two garage doors on the south side. We expect the garage doors would be approximately \$3,000 per door. Framing it in will be inexpensive. Mr. Baertlein stated it is not ideal, but it will work. Discussion occurred about batting cages.
