2015-16 MICHIGAN LEGISLATURE

- Legislative Turnover: 1/3
 Members "new"
- Republicans will have 63-47 and 27-11 majority in the House and Senate.
- New Leadership, Policy and Appropriations Chairs
- "Generally" more conservative

STATE LETTER GRADES

Proposal: Establishes a school transparency dashboard, a new school accountability system and assigns a letter grade to each school based on school performance.



CONCERNS

- High States Accountability: 100% of an elementary schools and 75% of a high school would based solely on one test.
- Assessments: Schools will be judged on a test students haven't yet seen.
- Add More Targets: The bill adds a new transparency dashboard.
- Creates Multiple Accountability Systems: In order to meet the requirements of the Federal flexibility waiver may need to adopt multiple systems.

PERFORMANCE EVALUATION SYSTEMS (PES)

 Legislation Stalled: Subject more to politics that policies



- Current Law: Evaluate job performance using multiple rating categories that take into account data on student growth as a significant factor. Student growth must be measured, at least in part, using the state assessments. (PA 257 of 14)
- What now: Beginning with the 2015-2016 shall ensure that the (PES) shall include at least a annual *year-end* evaluation. At least 50% of the annual year-end evaluation based on student growth. (May Be Amended)
- Financial Support: None; subject to policy bills

EARLY WARNING SYSTEM

We support an effective early warning system that provides school districts with the data they need to avoid future deficits.



- Proposal is too broad: 17 different triggers. Solution: Utilize existing private sector tools that determine financial performance in a district. Don't recreate the wheel.
- **Too much paperwork**. Must submit periodic financial status reports in the form and manner and on the periodic basis prescribed by the Department of Treasury. Solution: Replace siloed proposal with a system closer to the distressed districts.
- Circumvents the Emergency Manager Process. Bypasses due process, the review, local meetings, posting, finding of facts, hearing, consent agreement and governance provisions and places a district directly into the EM. Solution. Rework DEP to force more communication and authority within MDE and Treasury.
- Impacts all Districts. ALL districts are required to submit budget assumptions to CEPI every year. Their ISD must then verify those assumptions. Solution: Don't regulate to the exceptions.

FOIA CHANGES (PA 563 OF 2014)

- New FOIA regulations July 1, 2015.
- Standard form (Itemize 6 fee components)
- Must provide records on non-paper media stipulated by the requestor.
- Can't charge more than
 \$0.10/sheet for copies.

- Post procedures, guidelines, and summary on website.
- Increased penalty for violating act

CYBER BULLYING (PA 478 OF 2014)

Modifies Matt's Safe
 School Law (PA 241 of 201) to include
 cyberbullying



- Districts must modify bullying policies to forbid cyberbullying by September 18th
- "Cyberbullying" is defined as "any electronic communication that is intended or that a reasonable person would know is likely to harm one or more pupils" by....
- Doesn't give schools direction on extent of jurisdiction over off-campus cyberbullying
- Schools are placed in the position of either not disciplining off-campus cyberbullying because the discipline would likely be challenged successfully on First Amendment grounds, or disciplining in violation of the First Amendment.

- When: May 5, 2015
- Coalition, Polling and Messaging being developed. More information January 30th.

What it does:

- Increases the Sales tax 6% to 7%
- Directs current gas tax to roads.
- Prohibits Univ's from SAF, adds Community Colleges and CTE
- At-Risk District Funding
- Main Street Fairness Act
- EITC
- Adequacy study

Revenue Conference:
