While we serve a high-need and at-risk population, our past systems have not delivered student success at expected levels.

# Our Analysis Revealed Four Systemic Root Causes



## Core Instruction & Curriculum

- Inconsistent alignment to state standards, especially in math.
- Focus on remediation over Tier-1 grade-level instruction.
- Inconsistent implementation of high-quality instructional materials (HQIM).



## Data Use & Progress Monitoring

- Lack of systematic routines for continuous data monitoring.
- No schoolwide MTSS structure for intervention pathways.
- Unclear process for addressing identified learning gaps.



## Graduation & Readiness Systems

- Inconsistent intake and credit tracking for a highly mobile population.
- Limited advanced coursework and inconsistent career pathway promotion.
- Procedural gaps from registrar/counseling turnover led to inaccurate dropout coding.



## Talent, Support, and Conditions

- Attrition in key positions leading to instructional gaps.
- Inconsistent onboarding and support for novice teachers.
- Classroom environments not consistently conducive to learning due to behavioral challenges.

# Priority 1: Establishing Academic Rigor & Pacing

## ➤ Standardized Pacing

Implementation of mandated pacing guides tied strictly to standards with concrete student learning objectives.

## ➤ Assessment Volume

Mandated policy of two 'grades' per week in every class.

## ➤ Quality Control

Requirement that at least one weekly grade is a true assessment of learning, distinguishing academic mastery from simple participation.

## ➤ Staffing Shift

Strategic reassignment of staff duties to create a dedicated academic interventionist role specifically for Tier 3 student support.



## Priority 2: Building a Responsive Data Culture

Central Data Dashboard Metrics: Attendance, Discipline, Walkthroughs, IXL, Credit Recovery, Missing Assignments, Failures.



# Holistic Student Support Structures



## Bi-Weekly Grade Level Teams

Meetings specifically to plan and implement support for students struggling with behavior and culture.



## Bi-Weekly Advisory Teams

Dedicated time for college and career planning, internship tracking, and community service tracking.



# Priority 3: Securing Student Outcomes & Graduation



## Attendance Intervention (FINS Process)

- 20 FINS files generated for attendance at end of Semester 1.
- 4 FINS-warning letters sent to parents regarding attendance thresholds.

# Elevating Expectations & Future Readiness



## Intervention Block

Implementation of "Homework Club" for students with missing assignments.

## Workforce Integration

Expanded exposure through internship opportunities specifically for 11th and 12th-grade students.

## Advanced Academics

Increased AP access

Specific Goal: Students enrolled in both AP Literature and AP Language and Composition for 2025-26.

# Priority 4: Teacher Observation & Feedback

## Systematized Observation



Creation of weekly observation schedules utilizing an expanded team of four observers.

## Incentivizing Excellence




Implementation of teacher leaderboards based on observation metrics.

# Contextualizing the Letter Grade

The “F” grade is a statistical anomaly.



Distance from a “C” Grade was minimal, indicating the school is on the cusp of higher performance.



# The Financial Stakes & Critical Timing

## Current Impact

Facility funding has already been withheld for this school year.

## The Critical Threat

We are in a critical timing window for the financing process with Hope Enterprise Corporation.

### Warning:

Probationary status could directly endanger this financing and the school's physical infrastructure.



# **Rationale for the Requested Outcome**

## **1. Redundancy**

Probation is already ‘baked in’ to the state accountability system.

## **2. Punitive Sufficiency**

The withholding of facility funding demonstrates that accountability measures are already active and felt.

## **3. Strategic Necessity**

Avoiding the official ‘Probationary’ label is essential to secure the Hope Enterprise Corporation financing.
