School Operations Updates

Interpreting Services

ASD hired Clayton Higgins in October as an Interpreter Coordinator. He services as a staff interpreter and coordinates contract and agency services for our schools. Clayton has taken initiative to provide training to staff, support multiple types of situations, and has already taken on an intern to facilitate the "grow your own" model.

Clayton presented a report regarding the savings we are experiencing by having a staff interpreter on campus. It is important to note that the position was cross graded from another position, no new positions were requested. Please see below:
