

Optional Flexible School Day Program

The Texas Education Agency's (TEA) Optional Flexible School Day Program (OFSDP) allows school districts to provide <u>flexible hours and days</u> of attendance for students who are at risk of dropping out, have already dropped out, or are behind in core subjects.



Graduation Alliance (GA) Dropout Prevention and Recovery

Program Features

- Provides flexible, personalized pathways for students to complete HS
 - Provides local academic coaches and mentors
 - Provides certified teachers
 - Provides social-emotional support and wraparound services
 - Provides flexible pacing
 - Provides access to coursework tailored to Texas graduation requirements
 - Locates, reengages and partners with the district to reenroll Leavers

Graduation Alliance Cost Neutral & Funding Positive Model

ADA course funding eligibility back to districts

- Funding is based on Average Daily Attendance (ADA).
- Attendance is determined by course completions.
- District reclaims state funding for ADA provided by our course completion reports that are submitted through the PEIMS department.
- District is only billed if a student course is funding eligible.
- No billing on federal student funding like SPED or ESL.

KISD Eligibility Criteria

The District Review Committee will consider students who:

- *Have been coded as a dropout (L98) from 21-22, 22-23, 23-24, and 24-25
- Have exhausted comprehensive high school and Pathways Academic Campus options
- Have passed a minimum of 3 STAAR assessments and are no more than 22 years old as of September 1 of the current school year
- Have an address within the Killeen Independent School District

*504/SPED/EB needs will be reviewed by the appropriate committee to review needs and determine placement

Graduation Alliance will...

TLL SCHOOL SCHOO

- 1. Identify and recruit Leavers.
- 2. Provide certified teachers and counselors for online instruction.
- 3. Provide all hardware and software.
- 4. Provide academic oversight for participants.
- 5. Monitor student progress via the Graduation Alliance counselor.
- 6. Notify participants over the age of 18 of unsatisfactory performance.
- 7. Provide general accommodations for 504, Special Education, and Emergent Bilingual students.
- 8. Attend weekly meetings with KISD personnel.
- 9. Prepare course completion reports for Average Daily Attendance (ADA) and share with KISD staff.

Killeen ISD will.....

- 1. Provide the list of Leavers to Graduation Alliance.
- 2. Establish a District Review Committee to determine eligible participants.
- 3. Re-enroll students recruited by Graduation Alliance via support from Pathways Academic Campus.
- 4. Provide 504, Special Education, and Emergent Bilingual services for students, as needed.
- 5. Provide access to the library at Pathways High School during school hours.
- 6. Share Student Code of Conduct expectations with re-enrollees.
- 7. Attend weekly meetings with the GA program manager



Requested Action by the KISD Board of Trustees

- 1. Approve the recommendation for Killeen ISD to participate in the Optional Flexible School Day Program to recapture dropouts who meet the district's eligibility criteria.
- 2. Sign the application to submit to TEA and the partnership with Graduation Alliance.
- 3. Sign the MOU for Graduation Alliance.
