- Assessment Materials Grant Thanks to Sherry Bingham and her staff for their work in applying for this grant. We were awarded \$6,646 from the State Department of Education to purchase Special Education Assessment Materials.

In emails and phone calls the next week it was determined that it would be better if we supported a proposal by the SDE rather than force our bill, which I did, calling Senator Mortimer on February 13 to encourage him in hearing the SDE Proposal.

During the Day on the Hill I also visited with Speaker Bedke, Representative Fred Wood, Senator Kelly Anthon, and Representative Lance Clow (Twin Falls), Chair of the House Education Committee.

District Happenings

- Love & Logic Classes were offered at Rupert Elementary School in January and earlier this month. There were eight parents in attendance. The class will be offered again starting March 4 at Paul Elementary. The Boys and Girls Club of the Magic Valley in Rupert will be providing free child care and we pay for the workbooks. The two teachers for the class are Sue Cooper, a retired Minidoka teacher, and Carol Loveless, who currently teaches at Acequia.
- Vaping Grant On February 10 we had a Town Hall and shared some additional information about the dangers of Vaping and announced the <u>Media Contest Winners</u>.
