Celebration of the New Gym: Show video

Dec. 2nd, the North Slope Borough and the Village of Kaktovik hosted a huge celebration to welcome the new gym to the community. The night was filled with dancing, dedication speeches, amazing food, and music by Mark Brown.

Not long after that, our students held their own ribbon-cutting ceremony, officially opening the gym for school use.

Students and staff worked together to establish expectations using our Community School Expectation Agreement and our Positive Behavior Intervention & Supports, known as **RAMS**.

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Students, staff, and the community have a schoolwide goal of reaching 1000 laps around the new track. As of 2-6-26, we are at **628**. Night Rec. is alive and well attended. We have at least 2 adults in the gym for school-aged times.

Focus: Reliability with the key card system. We experienced a few typical “new car” start-up glitches. These are being addressed promptly and effectively by our outstanding Plant Manager, Randy Linderbaum.



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


You Science: Aptitude Versus Interest
