New to the Migrant Program

- Preschool Initiative
 - 4 School Districts in Idaho have been invited to be apart of the program
 - The Migrant program will provide Minidoka with an assessment for our preschool students
 - After looking at the data, we will determine where our focus will be.
 - Once the determination has been made, they will provide us with curriculum and resources to increase the scores
 - 7 states are apart of the initiative.
 - One district in Idaho will be chosen as the spotlight district when the SDE presents to the Migrant Education Foundation in Washington D.C.
 - We are currently in year 2 of 3.

Recruiting Families

- Visited and will continue to visit:
 - Motels
 - Paul HousingAll Shelters

 - Farms
- Weekly enrollment checks for all schools
 - Sylvia Benavidez makes phone calls to help determine if an interview should be conducted
- Referrals from other families and/or other districts
- Extensive paperwork is being done to ensure that all students are being identified and tracked

Services Provided

- Migrant Graduation Specialist meets with all secondary migrant students on a trimester basis to keep track of their grades, and give them the support they need. At the high school level, programs and scholarships are being introduced.
- A parent committee meeting is held once a month to help plan for the PAC meetings, discuss topics of concerns, interests and the needs of all migrant families.
- Three parent meetings a year in which services are trainings will be provided such as gangs, drugs, Powerschool, math, etc.
- A community outreach packet is given to new and existing families in the Migrant Program based off a needs assessment from the parents. This is put together by Sylvia Benavidez.
- Migrant Summer School

Opportunities to Learn

- Three PAC meetings a year
- ESL classes offered by CSI housed in our district office on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Child care is provided.
 Currently, we are still trying to find a certified teacher.
- Love & Logic class in Spanish (Spring 2017)
- 2 Migrant parents attend the PPAT monthly meetings
- Preschool Initiative Committee
 - 2 parents are apart of the team
