Burleson exceeds the cap by three students in kindergarten. The addition of portable structures will be a consideration to address the need for classroom space for the 2008-2009 school year. The District has hired a demographer to study campus attendance boundaries and submit recommendations for boundary adjustments.

Burnet exceeds the cap by four students in grade two and four student in grade four. The addition of portable structures will be a consideration to address the need for classroom space for the 2008-2009 school year. The District has hired a demographer to study campus attendance boundaries and submit recommendations for boundary adjustments.

Dowling exceeds the cap by two students in grade one, one student in grade three, and three students in grade four. The addition of portable structures will be a consideration to address the need for classroom space for the 2008-2009 school year. The District has hired a demographer to study campus attendance boundaries and submit recommendations for boundary adjustments.

Murry Fly exceeds the cap by nine students in kindergarten. Construction is scheduled for the 2008-2009 school year and will include the addition of two classrooms. An aide has been allocated to the kindergarten teachers to assist with the enrollment. The addition of portable structures will be a consideration to address the need for classroom space for the 2008-2009 school year. The District has hired a demographer to study campus attendance boundaries and submit recommendations for boundary adjustments.

Hays exceeds the cap by four students in kindergarten and one student in second grade. The campus is scheduled to open a new academic magnet program with specific student qualification guidelines in fall 2008. The application process will prevent classrooms from exceeding the cap.

Ireland exceeds the cap by two students in first grade. Construction is scheduled for the 2008-2009 school year and will include the addition of two classrooms. The addition of portable structures will be a consideration to address the need for classroom space for the 2008-2009 school year. The District has hired a demographer to study campus attendance boundaries and submit recommendations for boundary adjustments.

Johnson exceeds the cap by eight students in grade three. Construction is scheduled for the 2008-2009 school year and will include the addition of two classrooms. The addition of portable structures will be a consideration to address the need for classroom space for the 2008-2009 school year. Also, the Host Program concept for bilingual education is under review and consideration will be given to relocating this program to a campus with a smaller enrollment. The District has hired a demographer to study campus attendance boundaries and submit recommendations for boundary adjustments.

Noel exceeds the cap by four students in kindergarten, one student in grade two bilingual, two students in grade three bilingual, and one student in grade three. The addition of portable structures will be a consideration to address the need for classroom space for the 2008-2009 school year. Also, the magnet concept for Noel is under review with changes to the program occurring in Spring, 2008. The District has hired a demographer to study campus attendance boundaries and submit recommendations for boundary adjustments.

Pease exceeds the cap by four students in grade two and 3 students in grade two bilingual. Construction is scheduled for the 2008-2009 school year and will include the addition of two classrooms. The District has hired a demographer to study campus attendance boundaries and submit recommendations for boundary adjustments.

Sam Houston exceeds the cap by one student in grade two. Normal attrition should balance the class load by the end of the semester.
