
Granby Summer Programming 2020





A summer like no other...

Purpose was to provide continued instructional learning for students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) as recommended through PPTs in accordance with state laws.

- All of our programs (PreK-12) were offered remotely this summer to our IEP students through a synchronous format.
 - Reading and Math Labs
 - Tutoring
 - Academic Classes in ELA and Math
 - Social Skills Camp
 - Speech and Language Therapy
 - Occupational Therapy
 - Physical Therapy
 - Camp Kelly (Pre-K)



Social Skills Camp/Support

- Conducted remotely all 4 weeks. Parent support groups were also provided on Fridays.
- 17 students participated/were supported in this model

Camp Kelly

- 4 weeks duration with synchronous and asynchronous opportunities for students
- Preschool students
- OT, PT, and Speech provided during the hours of the program

New this summer:

- Remote Learning
- Proactive offerings for all students to minimize loss of skill or loss of credits (High School)
 - Intervention students were offered learning opportunities through our synchronous format. Most students/families participated in this opportunity.
 - Credit Recovery opportunity through synchronous format. Most students/families participated



Enrollment

- Special Education that were recommended and attended across all levels:
 - High School-20 students
 - Middle School-36 students
 - Wells Road-58 students
 - Kelly Lane-47 students (including PreK)
- Intervention Students that were recommended and attended include:
 - High School-8 students
 - Middle School-15 students
 - Wells Road-28 students
 - Kelly Lane-17 students

Feedback



Many families preferred the remote learning as it was easy to accommodate their vacation planning. Some families had their students attend sessions while on vacation.

Teachers enjoyed the sessions with the kids.

Families were impressed by the way teachers remotely engaged the students in creative ways.

Future Planning

Consider including students receiving Intervention Services during the summer programming options.

Possibly offering a remote option for the summer if that is more conducive to family schedules.
