AVAILABILITY OF ACCESS	Access to the District's electronic communications system, including the Internet, shall be made available to students <u>and</u> employees, <u>Board members, and VIPS</u> , primarily for instructional and administrative purposes and in accordance with administrative regulations. Limited personal use of the system shall be permitted if the use:		
	1. Imposes no tangible cost on the District;		
	2. Does not unduly burden the District's computer or network re- sources; and		
	3. Has no adverse effect on an employee's job performance or on a student's academic performance.		
USE BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC	Access to the District's electronic communications system, including the Internet, <del>may</del> be made available <del>granted</del> to members of the public <del>also</del> , in accordance with administrative regulations. Such use <del>may</del> <u>shall</u> be permitted so long as the use:		
	1. Imposes no tangible cost on the District; and		
	2. Does not unduly burden the District's computer or network re- sources.		
	Members of the public who are granted access shall be required to comply with District rules, regulations, and policies governing appropriate use of the system. [See CQ(REGULATION) and CQ (Exhibit)(D)]		
ACCEPTABLE USE	The Superintendent or designee shall develop and implement administra- tive regulations, guidelines, and user agreements, consistent with the pur- poses and mission of the District and with law and policy. <u>governing</u> copyright. [See EFE]		
	3. Access to the District's electronic communications system is a privi- lege, not a right. All users shall be required to acknowledge receipt and understanding of all administrative regulations governing use of the system and shall agree in writing to allow monitoring of their use and compliance to comply with such regulations and guidelines. Noncompliance may result in suspension of access or termination of privileges and other disciplinary action consistent with District poli- cies. [See DH, FN series, FO series, and the Student Code of Con- duct] Violations of law may result in criminal prosecution as well as disciplinary action by the District.

	4.	Restrict unauthorized disclosure, use, and dissemination of personally identifiable information regarding students; <b>and</b>
	5.	Educate students about cyberbullying awareness and response and about appropriate online behavior, including interacting with other individuals on social networking Web sites and in chat rooms.
