- On March 5th our MTSS Team met to complete the R-TFI- Reading Tiered Fidelity Inventory. This is an annual review of our systems to support reading instruction in Tier 1 and Advanced Tiers. SWPBIS TFI- Schoolwide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) Tiered Fidelity Inventory. This is an annual review of our systems to support PBIS in Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3. PET-M- Planning and Evaluation Tool for Mathematics. This is the first time the team has done this evaluation and it will be an annual review of our systems to support math instruction organized by 7 different sections. The inventories allow the team to determine the processes which are providing increased support for students both socially and academically.




