


- We will foster a sense of purpose and accomplishment.


#### <u>Grow</u>








#### Prek Interest Form 2021-2022



- Number of students pre-registered:



 Students will be assigned to a campus and then attend registration at that campus during the normal registration period in July








### Curriculum Updates


- New adoption for Pre-K: Three Cheers
  - Rewriting curriculum, assessment and report cards
  - Training for teachers will be August 4th
- Combining curriculum for Fred Moore and Virginia Gallian
  - Training for teachers on July 26 & 28th





#### 2021-2022 Programming

- We will offer 80 prekindergarten classrooms spread across the district.
- Additional Sites and Programs
  - We are adding one state-funded, bilingual program at Cross Oaks Elementary.
  - We are adding one state-funded/Academy hybrid at Hawk Elementary.
  - The monolingual section at Hodge Elementary is moving to Wilson Elementary to make room for growth at Hodge.




### 3 Year old Programming
