## ADMISSIONS INTERDISTRICT TRANSFERS

## **PROPOSED REVISIONS**

Authority	The Superintendent is authorized to accept or reject any transfer requests, provided that such action is without regard to race, religion, color, sex, disability, national origin, or ancestral language.
	<u>A resident student who becomes a nonresident during the course</u> of a semester shall be permitted to continue in attendance for the remainder of the semester.
	<u>OR</u>
<u>Residents Who</u> <u>Become</u> <u>Nonresidents</u>	A resident student in prekindergarten through grade 11 who be- comes a nonresident during the course of a semester shall be per- mitted to continue in attendance for the remainder of the semester.
	A resident student in grade 12 who becomes a nonresident shall be permitted to continue in attendance for the remainder of the school year.
Transfer Requests Children of District Employees	A child of a nonresident full-time District employee may request that his or her child be admitted into District schools by filing an ap- plication with the Superintendent in accordance with administrative regulations. attend the campus at which the child's parent is em- ployed or a campus determined by the department of school ad- ministration to be "open — having space available." Application shall be made in the time and manner set forth in administrative regula- tions, and t_ransfers shall be granted for one regular school year at a time, on a tuition-free basis.
<del>All Others</del>	A parent or legal guardian who is not a full-time District employee wishing to transfer a nonresident student into the District shall file an application for transfer each school year with the Superinten- dent or designee. Transfers shall be granted for one regular school year at a time.
	A nonrefundable fee of \$25 shall be required with each application for a nonresident child whose parent or legal guardian is not a full- time District employee.
<u>Transfer Requests</u>	A nonresident student wishing to transfer into the District shall file an application for transfer each school year with the Superinten- dent. Transfers shall be granted for one regular school year at a time.

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Factors	A transfer for a nonresident child whose parent or legal guardian is not a full-time District employee may be granted, subject to the ad- mission criteria and upon receipt of a transfer request and execu- tion of a transfer agreement form. In approving transfers, the Su- perintendent or designee shall consider availability of space and instructional staff, as well as the student's academic performance, overall-disciplinary history, and attendance records.
	The following admission criteria shall be considered:
	<ol> <li>The student must have passed all core classes, with a final grade of at least 70 during the prior school year.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>The student must have maintained an attendance rate of at least 90 percent for all classes during the prior school year.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>A public school student must have taken and passed, at the "met standard" level or above, all sections of the most recent administration of any state-mandated assessment on the first administration.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>A currently enrolled student from an accredited private or pa- rochial school, as listed by the Texas Private School Accredi- tation Commission, must have performed at grade level or above on the most recently administered national assess- ment.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>A student from a homeschool or nonaccredited school setting must demonstrate achievement at the 70 percent level or above on the District delivered academic screening assess- ment.</li> </ol>
	6. The student must:
	a. Not have been assigned to a DAEP or removed or ex- pelled during the prior calendar year,
	b. Have no criminal charges pending, and
	<ul> <li>Not currently be on probation or under community super- vision for a criminal offense.</li> </ul>
	<ol> <li>The student must have no outstanding fees or fines imposed by the previous district.</li> </ol>
<u>Tuition</u>	If the District charges tuition, the amount shall be set by the Board, within statutory limits.
<u>Waivers</u>	The Board may waive tuition for a student based on financial hard- ship upon written application by the student, parent, or guardian. [See FP]
