At this moment, we are in the process of ratifying our Bargaining Agreement (thank you to the FTF Bargaining Team and the CCC Administrative Team for their good work).


Mark Yannotta (Mathematics)

This summer, math faculty member, Mark Yannotta presented at the 13Th Congress of the European Society for Research in Mathematics Education (CERME13) in Budapest, Hungary. Of the roughly 900 people who were accepted to present at the conference, 35 educators were from the US, but only five of those individuals were affiliated with two-year colleges. Hence, Mark had many opportunities to engage in meaningful conversations about CCC's mission, our courses, and our students. In addition to presenting his work, strengthening some ties with colleagues at Utrecht University in the Netherlands, and gleaning more research-informed ideas for his practice, Mark made new connections with mathematics educators from Portugal, Germany, Italy, and several other countries throughout this week-long conference.

Mark would like to thank the Clackamas Community College Mathematics Department, the AFaC Division, and the Grants Office for continuing to support his work that focuses on two-year college mathematics bridge courses. He would also like to thank the National Science Foundation for funding this unique experience to participate in CERME13 in Budapest, where the themes of connection, collaboration, and cooperation were embodied throughout the entire week. It was one of the busiest, most eye-opening, and memorable academic conferences of Mark's career at the college.

Dawn Hendricks (Early Childhood Education):

In June, our dept. received notification that we were awarded two grants: Grow Your Own from the Dept. of Education and the Early Learning Higher Education Consortia grant from the newly formed Dept. of Early Learning and Care. Our Grow Your Own grant is for roughly \$612,000 over the next two years and our Early Learning grant is for about \$450,000. The bulk of the funds for both grants will be used to pay tuition for students to earn a certificate or degree.

Dawn also had an article on "Creating a College Pathway for Latinx" published in the <u>Child Care</u> <u>Exchange magazine</u>.

Yvonne Smith (Human Services):

Yvonne Smith has been appointed to serve on both the Clackamas County Public Health Advisory Council and the Governor's Commission on Senior Services.

She will also be presenting at the international Open Education Global conference in October in Edmonton, Ontario, Canada on writing and using equity-centered materials in human services courses, (based on the project completed as part of her sabbatical).

Mark Devendorf and students from his Documentary Film class completed a documentary film on human trafficking in the Portland Metro area. This has been a multi-year project. The film will premiere at The Kennedy School on September 26th and will also be available for viewing on CCCTV.
