Parents and staff continue to have the opportunity to sign up for a free text service that sends a text every evening with homework assignments. Many positive comments have been received on the service and this is another home-school connection to assist our students in academic achievement. I have implemented the service which is a great way to get messages to staff after working hours and on weekends.

SLO:

Students at all grade levels have been given the Fall SLO with the results-data being collected for Fall Student Growth.

Pre-Post Assessment:

Students at many grade levels are given a pre-assessment prior to the instructional lesson followed by a post-assessment in a continued effort to prepare our students for their educational journey. The teacher reviews the data-teaches the lesson-reviews the post assessment data and makes a decision on whether the skill has been mastered or if adjustments need to be made to re-teach the skill. The concept is a positive learning tool for both students and staff.
