

WEEK OF: October 9-12

WE ARE LEARNING

- ★ We are enjoying our science unit learning about landforms and bodies of water. We finished two hands-on labs last week creating models of mountains and showing how rain forms bodies of water and how those bodies of water move on Earth. Then, we became a river and modeled how rocks are moved and crushed into tiny rocks, making sand.
- ★ In math we are taking our knowledge about place value and applying that in writing numbers in different forms: standard, expanded, unit, and number words.
- ★ In reading we are reading fables and folktales. Students are learning how to retell a story using key details, characters, and setting, while determining the central message or the moral of the story. They are also learning how characters respond to problems.

Here's what we're continuing to work on this week:

- Math- Understand multiplication as equal groups. Beginning with 2's, 5's, & 10's. Solve using Repeated addition and draw an array Practice Flashcards!
- Reading-Identify the Main Idea and Details of a story. Determine Character Traits of main characters, & identify Antonyms, (opposite), ex: hot = cold
- Science- Weather & The Water Cycle and its impact.
