
Please remember there is no charge for your student to eat breakfast or lunch at school again this year. Remind your student they can eat free any day of the week.

Avoiding Library Fees & Fines

Students are allowed to check out up to 3 books for a 2-week loan period. Then the books must be returned, or renewed at that time. If the book isn't re-scanned by the due date, it becomes overdue and will begin receiving a fine of \$0.05 per day until it is returned. Language Arts classes come in every week to renew books, and the library can be used at free times during the day also. Lost or damaged books will have a replacement or repair fee added to the outstanding student's account. Fines and fees will make a student ineligible for PBIS activities if not paid before the deadline. Book fines travel within our school district to the next library, and if books need to be returned for another school, please give them to the Librarian. So keep books up-to-date, and be responsible with them in order to avoid library fines and fees.


Free to all middle school students



Through pre and posts tests, we have found that upon graduation of the SMART Moves Program, students have shown an average of a 90% increase in knowledge of risky behavior, underage drinking and drug abuse.

They stimulated my students to think about their future and what the decisions they are making now, will and can affect them currently and later in life ... {they} gave many facts and valid examples to back up the material given.
