Absences Notes: When a student is absent, the student must bring a note to the attendance office within **three days of the absence**.

After three days, parent notes may not be accepted and the absences will be considered unexcused. A **maximum of three (3) parent notes per semester** will be accepted as excused.



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INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

Our school has adopted The "I Love U Guys" Foundation's Standard Response Protocol (SRP). Students and staff will be training, practicing, and drilling the protocol.

COMMON LANGUAGE

The Standard Response Protocol (SRP) is based on an all-hazards approach as opposed to individual scenarios. Like the Incident Command System (ICS), SRP utilizes clear common language while allowing for flexibility in protocol.

The premise is simple - there are five specific actions that can be performed during an incident. When communication these, the action is labeled with a "Term of Art" and is then followed by a "Directive." Execution of the action is performed by active participants, including students, staff, teachers and first responders. The SRP is based on the following actions: Hold, Secure, Lockdown, Evacuate, and

HOLD

"In Your Classroom or Area"

Students are trained to:

- Clear the hallways and remain in their area or room until the "All Clear" is announced
- Do business as usual
 Adults and staff are trained to:
- Close and lock the door
- Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

SECURE

'Get Inside. Lock outside doors'

Students are trained to:

Return to inside of building

- Do business as usual Adults and staff are trained to:
- Bring everyone indoorsLock the outside doors
- Increase situational awareness Account for students and adults
- Do business as usual

LOCKDOWN

"Locks, Lights, Out of Sight

- Students are trained to: Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
 Adults and staff are trained to:
- · Recover students from hallway if possible
- Lock the classroom door
- Turn out the lights
- · Move away from sight
- Maintain silence
- Do not open the door
- Prepare to evade or defend

EVACUATE 'To a Location'

Students are trained to:

- Leave stuff behind if required to
- If possible, bring their phone

Follow instructions

- Adults and staff are trained to: . Bring roll sheet and Go Bag (unless instructed not to bring anything with them, dependent on reason for evacuation.)
- Lead students to Evacuation location
- Account for students and adults
- Report injuries or problems using Red Card/Green Card method.

SHELTER

- Drop, cover and hold
- Get to high ground



Math Intervention Tips for Home

Telling The Time Activity

Time is one of those things many children find tricky, but this game will help your child tackle this topic.

What you need to play:

Chalk

How to play:

Step 1: Try drawing a clock on the ground with chalk.

Step 2: Then, get your child to use their body to make the hands of the clock. They could show just the hour or minute hands by lying straight, or they could use their body to make the hour and the minute hands, with their legs (the longer part) being the minute hand and their torso (the shorter part) the hour hand.

Kinder Updates

This week in kindergarten we are focusing on the following:

Reading: This week we are focused on reviewing what we have learned about the life cycle of a plant and starting our very own Plant Experiments.

Skills: This week we are focused reading words with the following double-letter spellings: 'ss', 'tt', 'zz', 'nn', 'pp','rr,' 'll', 'ck,' ch', 'sh', 'th', 'ng', 'qu', 'ck', 'ff."

Students will practice reading with purpose and understanding.

Students will begin working on End of Unit Assessments.

Math: We are focused on working with decomposing numbers 8 and 9

SS/Science: Next week we will be in Science. We are going to be learning about Plant parts. We are going to explore the structure of plants including roots, stems, leaves, flowers, and fruits.

3rd Grade Updates

Math: In math this week we will investigate fractions and identify parts of a fraction. The focus TEKS are 3.3C and 3.3A. Our homework will be focused on representing fractions using concrete and pictorial models.

Science: In science this week we will continue studying force and motion. We will be investigating pushes, pulls, magnetism, and gravity. Our focus TEKS for this week are 3.7A and 3.7B.

ELAR: We will conclude our unit on The Solar System this week as we will plan, draft and finalize our narrative writing about life in space. Our main TEKS for the week will be 3.11B

4th Grade Updates

This week in reading, we continued and finished our poetry unit. We worked on tone, stanzas, lines, and more figurative language.

In math, we finally finished our fraction unit! We made it! Fractions were hard. Please take every opportunity possible to continue talking about fractions with your child. Now, we are working on our geometry unit. Geometry is a lot of new vocabulary for our kids. We wrote a total of 12 vocabulary words over the last two days and learned how to apply them in action. We talked about lines, rays, line segments, acute angles, right angles, and obtuse angles.

In science, we discussed the water cycle and how it repeats over and over again. We created water cycle diagrams and in the science lab, Mrs. Garcia showed us snow! Next week, we will work on other patterns on earth such as landforms and slow changes to Earth's surface.

5th Grade Updates

Reading: Memorize and recite Puck's speech from Shakespeare's: A Mid Summer Night's Dream and Unit 6 Assessment on Friday

Math: Balance a simple budget, Define income, payroll, sales and property taxes and interpret numerical expressions

Science: Study Organisms and Energy in Ecosystems
