4. SPECIAL PRESENTATION-OTHER

4.A. Lonestar Governance Goals 1 & 2

Ms. Ruby Palacios and Mr. Shawn Legget from Curriculum & Instruction presented the board with an update for Lonestar Governance Goals 1& 2 Ms. Palacios and Mr. Legget answered board questions regarding student outcomes, KG student reading fluency deficits, and comparisons between dual and monolingual students. Trustee Martinez emphasized the importance of having parental involvement with reading for student development. Trustee Maldonado mentioned that this is the first year using Stem scopes and that the previous year was only optional. Trustee Barnes asked if the new curriculum is being used at 100% district wide. (Ms. Palacios mentioned it is not being used 100% yet, but the district is moving in that direction.

4.B. School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) Annual Report

Ms. Julie Scott and Dr. Monica Reyes presented the board with the SHAC Annual Report for compliance purposes.

Ms. Scott mentioned that they encourage parental and student involvement to promote mental health wellness initiatives.

Trustee Borrego thanked Ms. Scott for volunteering to be a part of SHAC, and Trustee Maldonado suggested for administration consider bringing back the mental health days for employees to take without being docked from their sick days.

Trustee Borrego motioned to accept the SHAC report. Trustee Barnes seconded the motion.

5. PUBLIC HEARING

5.A. A Public Hearing Will Be Held Regarding the Canutillo ISD's Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST). The Public is Invited to Attend and Provide Public Comment.

Ms. Cristy Pulley presented the board and the community with information on the Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas. She explained to the board the contributing factors that influence the rating received, and she also answered questions from Trustee Maldonado concerning administrative costs and projected fund balance for the end of SY 2025.

Trustee Martinez asked the administration (Dr. Arellano) if the district could work on improving the FIRST rating for future years.

Mrs. Pulley explained that since the district has operated at a deficit for the past couple of years, it has consumed fund balance and reduced the amount of available days. She stressed the importance of making sure F.Y. 27 concerns are addressed and figuring out a way to adopt a balanced or surplus budget.

Board President Rodriguez and Trustee Maldonado expressed concerns over having a reduction in force in the past and having the administration request positions during the year.

No Community members addressed the board during the hearing.

5.B. Discussion and Possible Action of Approval of the Canutillo ISD's Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST)

Trustee Borrego motioned to approve the acceptance of the FIRST rating.

Seconded by trustee Martinez.

6. BOARD OF TRUSTEE BUSINESS

6.A. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Allocation of a Percentage from Property Sales Proceeds to a Fund for Future Builds

Trustee Ortega requested that Dr. Rico and Ms. Pulley approach the board for advice on the idea of using proceeds from land sales towards the creation of a future build account.

Mrs. Pulley explained how the idea would allocate funds and it would hurt the district financially. Dr. Rico explained to the board that it could be an idea to analyze in the future and that, at this time, money influx is being used to address current needs such as deferred maintenance.

Board President Rodriguez addressed the board, explaining that they should not be telling the administration how to manage funds. Trustee Maldonado explained that this is not telling the administration how to manage money, but a reminder on how to remain frugal on expenses. Trustee Ortega expressed concern about reaching a time when there is not going to be any additional land to sell for the district.

6.B. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding District Compliance With Senate Bill 10.

Dr. Arellano addressed the board regarding the acceptance of the donation of 10 Commandments posters. Mr. Steve Blanco mentioned that after accepting the donation, the board needs to decide whether posters will be posted.

Trustee Martinez explained that “The law is the law”, everyone has different religions and asked if the donation could be returned to the donor. Trustee Borrego expressed her concerns over the separation of church and state, as there are many different beliefs, and everyone feels that their belief is the right one. The board members also talked about the Attorney General's ongoing litigation and how only the districts that are part of the litigation are excluded from posting at this time. The student Advisors provided feedback and explained that from the student body perspective, it won't make a difference whether they are posted and that students won't care.

Trustee Barnes explained that posters can be posted, and if there are changes with the attorney's general litigation, they can simply be taken down. She also shared that if they are posted and there are any lawsuits, the attorney general would take the case.

Board President Rodriguez asked legal if the board could vote to postpone the decision until litigation is settled. Mr. Blanco explained that ultimately, that is a board decision.

Trustee Maldonado motioned to wait on the posting of the 10 Commandment posters until pending litigation is finalized. Trustee Martinez seconded the motion.

Mr. Ortiz and Mr. Panahi from Banes General Contractors explain to the board that each site has unique groundwork needs and that their goal is to remain within or under the guaranteed maximum price.
