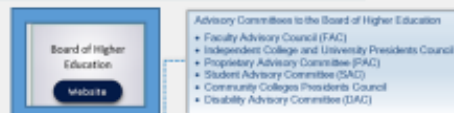

Statewide Boards and Commissions



Community colleges are organized under the Illinois Board of Higher Education (IBHE) and the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB).

IBHE and ICCB are governing boards that, advance State policy, approve programs and curriculum, and provide a portion of funding.

Community colleges are directed by the Illinois Public Community College Act – 110 ILCS 805/1-1 to 805/8-2.

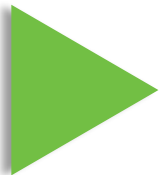

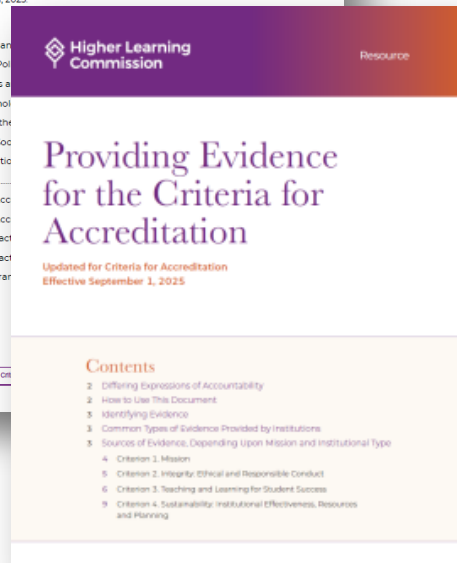
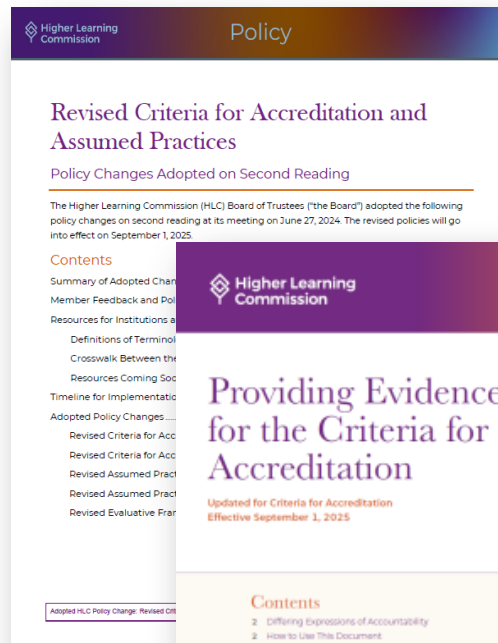
2020 Criteria (ending 8/31/25)

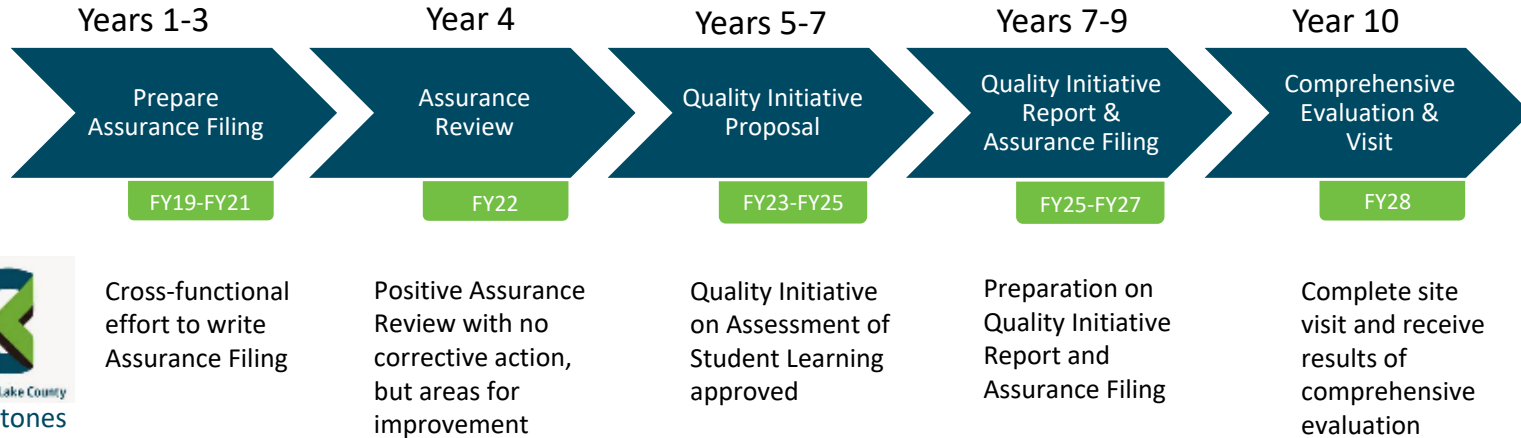

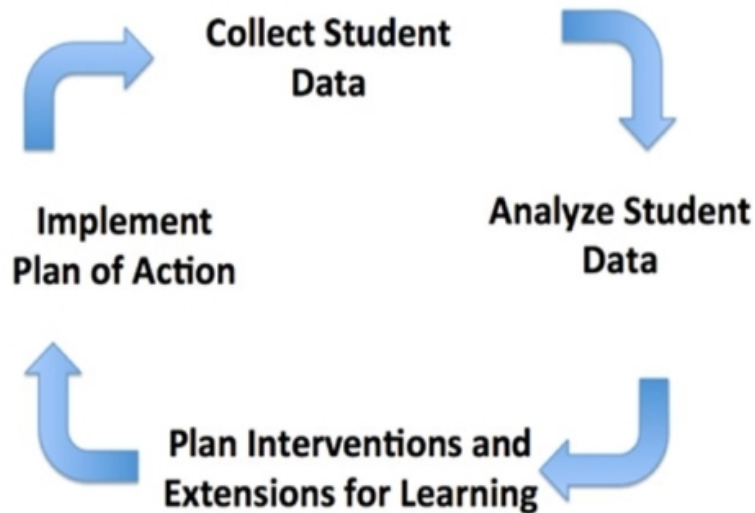
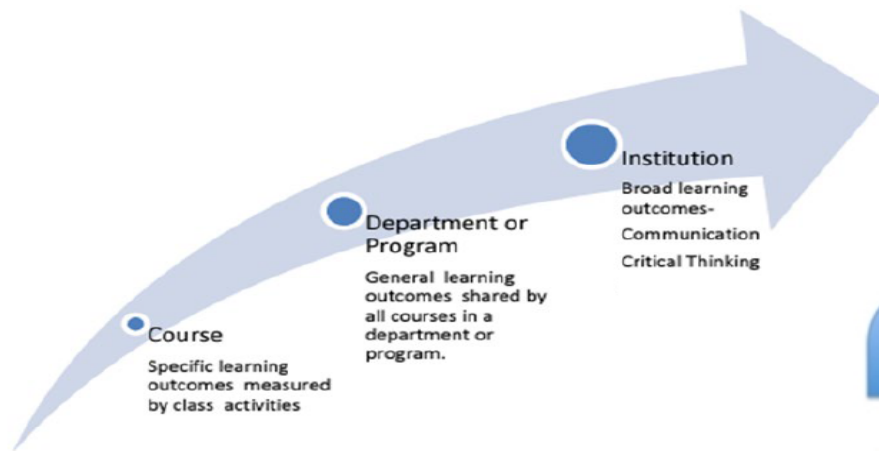
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Criteria 3. Teaching and Learning for Student Success

- 3E. Assessment of Student Learning
 - The institution improves the quality of educational programs based on its assessment of student learning.
- 3F. Program Review
 - The institution improves its curriculum based on periodic program review.
- 3G. Student Success Outcomes
 - The institution's student success outcomes demonstrate continuous improvement, taking into account the student populations it serves and benchmarks that reference peer institutions.
