WORK SESSION: The Board reviewed progress on Duchesne High building plans.

**REGULAR SESSION**: President Harding called the regular session to order at 7:01 p.m. Mr. Smith offered prayer. Mr. Harding led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

- School Vaping Litigation Kirton & McKonkie Proposal Mr. Harding moved to approve joining the class
  action law suit against the manufacturer JUUL for costs and difficulties incurred to deal with student vaping.
  Mr. Harding moved to approve; Mr. Bench seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
