#### Lincoln Elementary School Family Engagement Policy

#### Part 1. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Lincoln Elementary School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

Lincoln Elementary School will provide all parents information in a timely manner about Title I, Part A programs that include a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet by:
  - Intervention teachers may participate in the scheduled parent-teacher conferences
  - Student Report Cards
  - Explanations of student assessment results, MAP assessments, Star testing reports, Parcc
- 5. Lincoln Elementary School will provide opportunities for meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by:
  - Parent-teacher conferences in Fall and Spring
  - Parent suggestion opportunities at meetings
  - Planned parent/family activities
- 6. Lincoln Elementary School will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:
  - PARCC Reports and MAP Reports

- 7. Lincoln Elementary School will take the following actions to provide each parent timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified within the meaning of the term in section 200.56 of the Title 1 Final Regulations (67 Fed. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002) by: (see appendix A)
- 8. Lincoln Elementary School will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph-
  - the state's academic content standards,
  - the state's student academic achievement standards
  - the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments
  - the requirements of Part A,
  - how to monitor their child's progress
  - how to work with educators:
    - School District Website
    - Links to ISBE
    - Educational Websites
    - Assessment Reports
    - Parent Newsletters, by handouts or by district website
- 9. Lincoln Elementary School may provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster family engagement.
- 10. Lincoln Elementary School may, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
  - A Title I parent coordinator will organize parent and family activities
  - A Title I parent coordinator will organize literature to be distributed to students
  - A Title I parent coordinator will organize surveys for parents
- 11. Lincoln Elementary School will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate family engagement programs and activities. The school will also conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents in more fully participating in the education of their children, by:
  - Parent and Family Events
  - Annual Parent Breakfast
  - Grandparents Day
  - American Education Week Activities
  - Smart Buddy Programs
  - Resources for family engagement
  - Annual Meetings

- 12. Lincoln Elementary School will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:
  - Send a request for parent participation
  - Follow-up may include a written reminder or phone call
  - District Website
