This list is school instructions, not medical advice. Please contact your health care provider with health concerns. THE STUDENT MAY RETURN AFTER. SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS \*The list below tells the shortest time to stay home A student may need to stay home longer for some illnesses. \*Fever-free for 24 hours without taking fever-reducing Fever: temperature of 100.4°F (38°C) or greater \* Symptoms improving for 24 hours (no cough or cough New cough illness is well-controlled). \* Symptoms improving for 24 hours (breathing New difficulty breathing comfortably). Urgent medical care may be needed. \*Symptom-free for 48 hours OR with orders from Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery doctor to school nurse. stools in a day OR not able to control bowel movements \*Symptom-free for 48 hours OR with orders from Vomiting: one or more episode that is unexplained doctor to school nurse. \*Symptom-free OR with orders from doctor to school Headache with stiff neck and nurse. Follow fever instructions above. Urgent medical care may be needed. \*Symptom free, which means rash is gone OR sores are Skin rash or open sores dry or can be completely covered by a bandage OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. \*Symptom-free, which means redness and drainage are Red eyes with colored drainage gone OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. \*After the school has orders from doctor or local public Jaundice: new yellow color in eyes or skin health authority to school nurse. \*Symptom-free, which means return to normal Acting differently without a reason: behavior OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. unusually sleepy, grumpy, or confused. \*After the school has orders from doctor to school Major health event, like an illness lasting 2 nurse AND after measures are in place for the student's or more weeks OR a hospital stay, OR



# Parent Guide to Student Medications at School

#### Dear Parent/Guardian,

The school medication law is designed to protect student and school staff from harm. In order to administer medication to students the following requirements must be met:

- Medication must be brought into the school office by the parent/guardian.
   Please do not send medication on the bus or in with your child.
- Please do not send medication on the bus or in with your c
   Medication must be in the original container.
  - ▶ If medication needs to be split or cut please do so prior to bringing to school.
  - ▶ If medication needs to be crushed, please send pill crusher
  - If medication needs to be measured please send a correctly calibrated measurement device (i.e. liquid medication spoon).
- 3. School medication form must be filled out and signed.
  - Forms are available in school office.
  - ▶ If medication changes, a new form must be filled out and a new bottle with an accurate

# Guia para Padres Sohre Medicamentos para Estudiantes en la Escuela

#### Querido Padre/Guardian.

La ley de medicamentos de la escuela esta diseftada para proteger a los estudiantes y al personal escolar de cualquier dafto. Para administrar medicamentos a los estudiantes se deben cumplir los siguientes requisitos.

- 1. El padre/guardian debe traer los medicamentos a la oficina de la escuela.
  - No envie medicamentos en el autobus o con su hijo.
- 2. La medicacion debe estar en el envase original.
  - » Si es necesario dividir o cortar el medicamento, hagalo antes de traerlo a la escuela
  - ▶ Si es necesario triturar el medicamento, envie un triturador de pastillas
  - Si es necesario medir la medicacion, envie un dispositivo de medicion correctamente calibrado (es decir, una cuchara para medicacion liquida).
- 3. El formulario de medicamentos de la escuela debe ser completado y firmado.
  - ▶ Los formularios estan disponibles en la oficina de la escuela.
  - Si la medicacion cambia, se debe llenar un nuevo formulario y se debe traer a la escuela un nuevo frasco con una etiqueta precisa.

#### TITLE ONE

Applegate School is a Title 1 School. Title 1-A is the United States Government's largest educational assistance program for schools. The funds received from Title 1 are used to provide programs to help children who are struggling in reading and math by providing extra

help in addition to the core classroom instruction. This is a school wide program and all students are eligible to receive services. Student's progress is closely monitored and adjustments to instruction are made throughout the year as needed. Parent's rights include
