

there after.



Instructional Coaches: Happy New Year! December was quite busy for the instructional coaches. We began our month with meeting of our consultant, Debbie Hunsaker. Our focus is to ensure that the implementation plans are coming along smoothly, and providing PD for those who need it. Both coaches continued to meet with their teachers throughout the month although schedules were hectic. We did two modeling sessions- one in ELA and one in Math. This type of activity will be recorded and shared with staff who feel a need for refresher in specific areas of mathematics, and in the different components of our new and revised ELA framework. Our monthly progress monitoring testing occurred with a completion rate of 95% in ISIP testing. For STAR Math, we had a completion rate of 100%!- well it's actually 99.9% complete as we had only 2 students not test.

The current results for December testing on ISIP is as follows:


ISIPTM Early Reading results for Napi Elementary School at Browning Public Schools - 2019/2020 School Year

Counselors: Hard to believe it is January. Things are going pretty well providing Tier I-III social emotional, career and personal/crisis counseling at Napi Elementary. The counselors have just completed unit 1 on Empathy for all 4th and 5th graders and are just beginning unit 2 on controlling strong emotions using the Second Step Curriculum. The Spookinaapi Project has also begun to provide drug and alcohol prevention programming to all students as a component of the health enhancement curriculum and continue to provide tier I services to targeted student.

Prior to the holiday break, counselors made sure that student identified as McKinnie Vento (homeless) eligible received food to take home over the break and showers, clothing and hygiene products as needed.
