Objective: Decrease overall number of days that students are missing instruction due to discipline concerns.


Data Sources: Discipline Incident Collection submitted to ODE annually.



Class days are the total number of days students are excluded from class due to expulsions or suspensions (in or out of school)










Analysis

Successes:

- The percentage of students excluded from class each year declined for all racial/ethnic groups between 2012-13 and 2014-15.
- Between 2012-13 and 2014-15, the number of class days lost due to discipline for students in grades K-12 declined by 42%. Days excluded declined by 80% for Native American, Asian, and Pacific Islander students compared to 48% for Hispanic/Latino students, 26% for White students and 17% for Black students. Days excluded dropped by over 50% at the District's eight comprehensive middle schools compared to a 39% reduction in the five comprehensive high schools and 44% reduction in the 33 elementary schools.
- During the 2013-2014 school year there was a decrease in the number of students eligible for special education who were suspended or expelled for 10 or more days.
- In 2011-2012, 20 students eligible for special education who were suspended or expelled for 10 or more days did not receive interim education services. Starting in 2012-2013 and continuing in 2013-2014, ALL students who were suspended or expelled for 10 or more days received interim educational services.
- The likelihood that a white student eligible for special education would be expelled or suspended for 10 or more days decreased from 1.75 times in 2012-13 to 1.38 times more in 2013-14.
- The number of students starting the new academic year at Bridges Academy (formerly known as Deer Park Academy) is at an all time low.
- Revision of Student/Parent Resource Handbook to provide resources on alternatives to exclusionary practices.

Issues:

- Students of color continue to be excluded from class at a higher rate than
 their White peers, although the relative risk declined for Native
 American, Hispanic/Latino, and Pacific Islander. The relative risk of a
 Black student being excluded from class increased during this period. In
 2014-15, Black students in the Beaverton School District were three times
 more likely to be excluded from class than their White classmates.
- During the 2013-14 school year, Hispanic students eligible for special education were 4.83 times more likely to be suspended or expelled for

- greater than 10 school days. This is an increase from the 2012-13 school year.
- During the 2013-14 school year, students eligible for special education were 2.47 times more likely to be suspended or expelled for greater than 10 school days. This is an increase from the 2012-13 school year.
- Need for staff development to understand the purpose of discipline the need for moving away from "punitive" approach to "restorative" practices.
- Need for staff development for administrators and teachers to understand the connection between culturally responsive practices and discipline and academic disparities.

Action Plan

This year:

- Professional development for all school-based administrators on culturally responsive teaching.
- Professional development for MS administrators on teacher support.
- Professional development for HS assistant principals on equity leadership.
- Professional development for student supervisors on culturally responsive discipline practices and other alternatives to exclusionary practices.
- Development of best practice model for ES administrators to reduce exclusionary discipline practices.

Long-term:

- Implement restorative practices at all schools.
- Implement culturally responsive student behavioral management system at all schools.
- Infuse culturally responsive practice philosophy and practices into all aspects of school-based practices, including instruction, behavioral management, school culture, community engagement, extracurricular activities.
- Provide professional development on how to monitor, analyze and utilize discipline data collected on the new data system, Baseline Edge.
- Partnership with BEA to increase culturally responsive classroom practices.
