Operational Impact

PERSONNEL: No additional personnel needed.

BUDGET IMPACT: Funds provided from Perkins Grant, counseling budget, and a small amount from each campus.

COSTS:

Original cost for consultation, staff development, summer institute, set-up fee - \$21,790.00 Naviance Succeed Premier for a full year - \$31,680 annually

TIME FRAME: Year one – training of personnel, phase 1 implementation of Naviance Year two – Phase 2 implementation of Naviance Year three – full implementation of Naviance Long term plan – implementation of Naviance at middle school level

COMMITMENT REQUIRED FROM DISTRICT: Full support from Board of Trustees, district administration, building administration and faculty

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<u>Results</u>

It is expected that use of Naviance at the high schools will:

- enhance the college going culture at each of the high schools
- establish a platform in which college and career readiness milestones can be set for each grade level
- enhance counselor productivity allowing counselors to better meet the needs of ALL students
- track results for school and district administration
- increase the number of students pursuing careers that best fit the student's aptitude, interest and ability

Areas of concern:

- phasing the program in at a steady but manageable pace
- computer access for all students
- translation to Spanish in regard to the amount of time and man power required
