



BEAVERTON SCHOOL DISTRICT ADOPT 2015 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

- 1. <u>Funding</u> Oregon students deserve stable State school funding for their K-12 education including:
 - Our top priority of State School Fund (SSF) base allocation of \$7.3 Billion (Current Service Level) for the 2015-17 biennium
 - Allocation of \$200 million in funding for all day Kindergarten state-wide
 - Restore the 2003-05 K-12 funding level of 44.8% of the Oregon budget, currently allocated at 39.7% for 2013-15
 - Funding above Current Service Level for proposed statewide initiatives
- 2. <u>Instructional Time</u> Time in school is a fundamental element in a student's educational experience. Oregon students spend one year less in school than the national average in first through twelfth grade. The length of our school year puts students at a disadvantage, and they deserve the right to excel at the national and international level.
 - Invest in a full school year of quality time that engages students in rigorous course offerings
 - Provide flexibility for extended time for all students to be on track for the 40/40/20 goal
- 3. <u>Career and Technical Education</u> CTE will help our state meet the very real and immediate challenges of economic development and help students gain skills, technical knowledge, academic foundation and real-world experience they need to prepare for high-wage careers. A strategic investment in CTE would support:
 - Programs to provide 21st Century academic and technical skills for all students
 - Partnerships with business, industry, and community colleges to support students in making creative, personalized plans beyond high school

RECOMMENDATION:
