Every Day Matters and GGS is Here to Help!

Much of your child's learning today is built upon what they learned the day before! So when students miss school for any reason, excused or unexcused, this creates a gap and impacts their ability to participate in learning. This learning gap becomes significant when a student misses 10% or more of school. Though these absences may be excused, the student would still be considered chronically absent, and the school would likely be concerned for your student's academic success.

GGS wants your child to succeed and is focused on helping smooth the way to regular attendance. Share your challenges so the staff can help. We have many resources and staff to assist you, from our counselors, community resource coordinators, district nurse, you are not alone!

Students who are present for 90% or more in the month of February will get to have lunch and cookies with the Principal!

Ms. H's Counseling Corner

January was a month of review, and we have covered a lot of information from the start of our school year. The students did a fantastic job remembering how their brain works, and how we use this information to manage our emotions with our Tools. We practiced using our Quiet Safe Place Tool to be able to take a mini vacation in our mind when our emotional elevator starts to rise. We also discovered why it is often hard to use our Patience Tool, and how we need to pair it with other Tools to help us wait. Practice



makes progress, so if your child is facing an emotional challenge ask them "Which three tools could you try?"

The students were able to use their Tools as we learned about personal safety. We discussed using our Personal Space Tool and our Words Tool when handling situations where there is safe touch, unsafe touch and unwanted touch. We reviewed how to identify the size of our problem, and when it is important to report it to an adult.



The character trait for February is Kindness and it will also be the focus of my classroom lessons. As we spread kindness during this month, we will focus on using our Empathy Tool. This Tool will help us to see things from another person's perspective and figure out what would be the kind thing to do. We will also be having a Kindness Spirit Week, February 13-17th. PLEASE KEEP STUDENTS WITH SYMPTOMS OUT OF SCHOOL

SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS	THE STUDENT MAY RETURN AFTER *The list below tells the shortest time to stay home. A student may need to stay home longer for some illnesses.		
Fever: temperature of 100.4°F (38°C) or greater	*Fever-free for 24 hours without taking fever-reducing medicine.		
New cough illness	 Symptoms improving for 24 hours (no cough or cough is well-controlled). 		
New difficulty breathing	 Symptoms improving for 24 hours (breathing comfortably). Urgent medical care may be needed. 		
Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery stools in a day OR not able to control bowel movements	*Symptom-free for 48 hours OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.		
Vomiting: one or more episode that is unexplained	*Symptom-free for 48 hours OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.		
Headache with stiff neck and fever	*Symptom-free OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. Follow fever instructions above. Urgent medical care may be needed.		
Skin rash or open sores	*Symptom free, which means rash is gone OR sores are dry or can be completely covered by a bandage OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.		
Red eyes with colored drainage	*Symptom-free, which means redness and drainage are gone OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.		
Jaundice: new yellow color in eyes or skin	*After the school has orders from doctor or local public health authority to school nurse.		
Acting differently without a reason: unusually sleepy, grumpy, or confused.	*Symptom-free, which means return to normal behavior OR with orders from doctor to school nurse.		
Major health event, like an illness lasting 2 or more weeks OR a hospital stay, OR health condition requires more care than school staff can safely provide.	*After the school has orders from doctor to school nurse AND after measures are in place for the student's safety. Please work with school staff to address special health-care needs so the student may attend safely.

Art Literacy: Earth Pigments: Creating Paint from Nature

In February Sitka Art Literacy students will explore earth pigments and the process of pigment extraction from rocks and minerals under the expertise and guidance of Washington artist <u>Maja Sereda</u>. Maja is a multidisciplinary artist, teacher and coach. Born in Poland, Maja has dedicated her life to transcribing and sharing her experiences in nature. Working with a variety of media, her work explores the myriad of connections between human beings and the natural world. After studying graphic design at University of Pretoria in South Africa and working as an art director in advertising agencies, both in South Africa and Ireland, Maja became an award-winning book illustrator for more than a decade; she has illustrated more than 20 books.

Now based in Seattle, with a deep passion for nature, drawing and community, Maja is working on a project which aims to save endangered wildlife and protect precarious ecosystems while exploring creative processes and expression. Maja will be joining Sitka in select elementary school classes to share her knowledge and teach student specialized techniques for pigment extraction and watercolor paint creation.

During February lessons students will compare various types of rocks and discuss attributes necessary for easy pigment extraction, grind various materials using a mortar and pestle, and add binding agents such as Gum Arabic to create homemade watercolor paint. Students will study the concept of value and compare the ways that pigments can be altered to shift between tints and shades on a value scale. Following students will use homemade watercolor paint to create paintings that showcase values observed in nature found objects.

The Art Literacy Program is presented by Sitka Center for Art & Ecology, a non-profit organization. Through workshops, residencies and events the Sitka Center provides time and space for place-based reflection, inquiry and creation at the intersection of art and ecology.
