
September 2024 Special Education Board Report

positions.





SLD Criteria:

We are using a train the trainer model to ensure that all COSSA staff are implementing the new SLD criteria.

ISEE Reporting:

As we have been looking into ISEE reporting and ensuring that data is accurate for state reporting we have found that some districts were found out of compliance on 60 day timeline. Acceptable reasons to be beyond 60 days has been:

- Out of school for 5 consecutive school days (i.e. Christmas Break)
- Parent did not make student available for assessment (i.e. PK student not brought in for assessment)
- Written permission from parent to extend deadline
- Medical emergency of student (i.e. hospitalization)

This is reported in the June upload and cannot be corrected once uploaded (or so I'm told) so making sure that those students that were found initially eligible and have a N under 60 day timeline it's important those are coded correctly.

In addition we have to report all students evaluated that did not qualify for services as (DNQ) including PK students. This means we have to get EDUIDs for these students even if they never enroll in order to report these students to the SDE.
