Honors Diploma

Purpose:

1. Provide a valuable framework of standard requirements for students who are four-year college/university bound.
2. Offer an incentive for students to take challenging courses throughout their high school tenure.
3. Reward students who challenge themselves academically.
4. Provide students distinction when applying for college admittance and scholarships.

Credit Requirements – Rigorous coursework for all four high school years as described below:

GPA Requirements: GPA of 3.5 or 3.25 and 1650 SAT or 23 ACT score.

Other Requirements: Receive no D or F on transcript; pass 11th grade benchmarks and complete and pass all work samples (writing, speaking, mathematics problem solving, scientific inquiry) required for graduation. Additional requirements as per Board policy IKF—Graduation Requirements (i.e., Educational Plan & Profile, Extended Application, Career-Related Learning and Learning Experiences).

College Credits Required: Three for 2012-13; six for 2013-14; nine for 2014-15.

Implementation and Guidance:

Honors Diploma criteria will be published in all jr/sr high school student handbooks and other pertinent school materials.

Students interested in attaining an Honors Diploma must begin planning with their guidance counselors, class advisors, and parent(s)/guardian(s) early on in their high school careers to insure GPA and credit requirements are being met.
