# A- F Accountability Ratings & State Assessment

## A - F Accountability Ratings:

- TEA suspended accountability ratings but they will provide reports on STAAR/End of Course (EOC) participation and results for all students taking the assessments.

## STAAR & TELPAS Testing:

- STAAR and TELPAS testing is still scheduled for the Spring. Testing window for online testing has been extended to 5 weeks and the student assessment department will work with campuses to determine an optimal schedule for testing.
- Paper - Pencil testing will be subject to a specific testing date in early April and May.
- Results for spring testing will be available by June 25, 2021 for paper and online results will be available within 24 hours of testing.

## Excerpt from TEA's Letter to School Administrators

TEA will process and report **all available data** from the 2020–2021 school year but will not calculate accountability scores or assign A–F ratings. The underlying student achievement data can then be used by **legislative leadership, TEA, and school systems to inform changes moving forward and otherwise target resources to schools and students that need the greatest support.** Parents and educators can use this important information to gain a deeper understanding of individual student strengths and needs.

- **Google Classroom - Asynchronous Platform**



- a student-centered teaching method widely used in online learning that allows educators to set up a learning path for students to access learning materials and engage in learning at their own pace.

- **Google Meet -Synchronous Platform**



- Allows teachers to provide students with access to online real time teaching for student learning to take place. This includes live classes for whole group instruction and smaller in-person classes, live online meetings when the whole class or smaller groups get together.

# TEA Operation Connectivity & MiFi Project

## Operation Connectivity

- Prepare and Bid technical specifications

## Bus MiFi Project

- District installed 2 WiFi Routers (per bus) on 40 school buses.
- Buses were deployed throughout the city and into the rural areas including “colonias”, Rio Bravo and El Cenizo.
- This allowed students connectivity the Internet and access online school applications.

# Mobile Internet Access for Students

**Goal:** To provide students in need with Internet access to support virtual home instruction.

## Phase 1 - UISD MIFI Family Plan

- District Survey Results identified 1,645 families
- District Purchased 2500 MiFi's
- Mobile Internet Access Units checked out to the oldest sibling enrolled in a UISD school.

## Phase 2 - Operation Connectivity for All At Risk Students

- District Student Information System (SIS) identified 4,038 students eligible to receive a MiFi.
- 3000 additional MiFi's made available for students EC-12th Grade

# Access Points and Web Cameras

## Outdoor Access Points

- A total of 129 Outdoor Access Points were installed throughout 49 campuses.
- To allow students to access the Internet for virtual instruction while stationed within proximity of campus grounds and/or school parking lots.

## Remote Learning Web Cameras

- To support live daily video broadcasts for teaching and learning.
- Provided a webcam for PC's without integrated cameras on teacher desktop computers.
- IT installed 1,150 remote learning cameras in classrooms across the district.

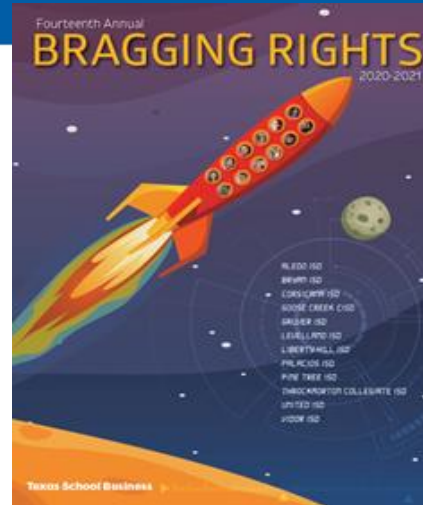

"We've had one death in 10 years," says Pineda, a licensed specialist in school psychology for the district. "It was important for us to have a structured process for recognizing and addressing, and then taking a district-wide approach to address it."

The first order of business in developing UISD's suicide prevention and intervention program was to create a district-wide suicide prevention manual that would address a comprehensive approach to identifying and helping students experiencing mental health issues.

A 40-page document, the manual provides step-by-step details for recognizing and responding to mental health issues in a school setting. Each year, professional development is provided to staff members to ensure they are equipped to help students who are struggling with mental health issues.

Another training is another annual parent training night, which includes discussions on student mental health.

## SOS® Signs of Suicide

- Only suicide prevention program in the USA that is scientifically proven to increase self-help skills and reduce actual suicide attempts.
- In Texas, only 9 school districts implement SOS, UISD is one of them.
- Since 2018: One annual lesson for Middle and High Schools
- School Counselors have been at the forefront providing these services
  - LSSPs provide program training
  - Director of Guidance and Counseling & LSSPs monitor program fidelity and provide support to counselors
- Program uses a simple and easy to remember acronym ACT®
  - **Acknowledge** that you are seeing signs of depression or suicide in yourself or a friend and that it is serious.
  - **Care** - Let your friend know how much you care about them and that you are concerned that they need help.
  - **Tell** a trusted adult that you are worried about yourself or a friend
