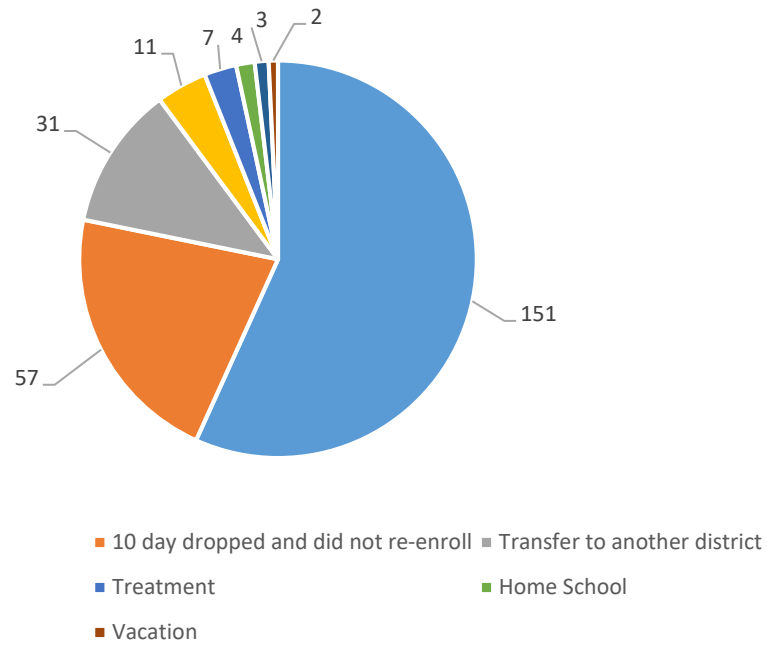


2017-2018 PSD Student Mobility - OUT

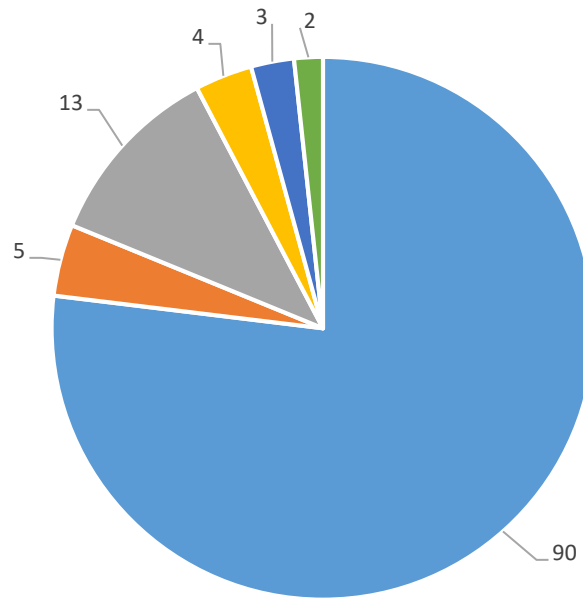


The Pendleton School District had 266 students withdraw this school year.

Of the 266 that left:

- 57% moved to another town
- 21% were dropped for lack of attendance
- 12% transferred to another school district
- 4% graduated early
- 3% entered a treatment program
- 1.5% are now being home schooled
- 1% were expelled
- >1% left for an extended vacation before the last day of school

Grades K-5 Student Mobility - OUT



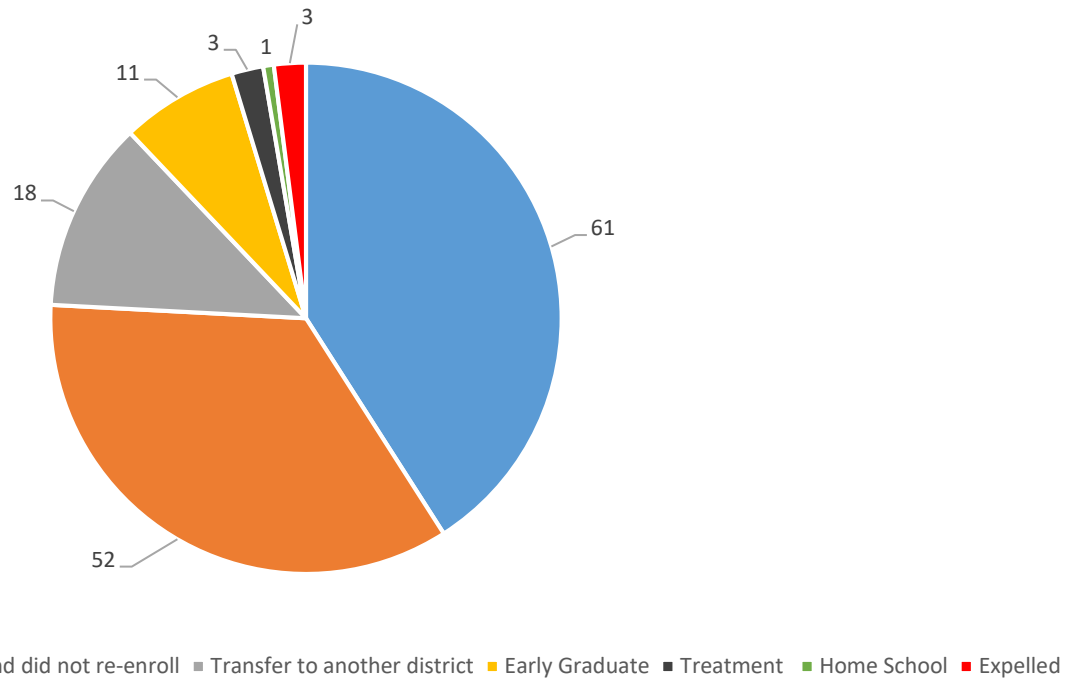
■ Moved to other town ■ 10 day dropped and did not re-enroll ■ Transfer to another district ■ Treatment ■ Home School ■ Vacation

The elementary schools had 117 students withdraw this school year.

Of the 117 that withdrew:

- 77% moved to another town
- 4% were dropped for lack of attendance
- 11% transferred to another school district
- 3% entered a treatment program
- 2.5% are now being home schooled
- 1% left for an extended vacation before the last day of school

Grades 6-12 Student Mobility - OUT

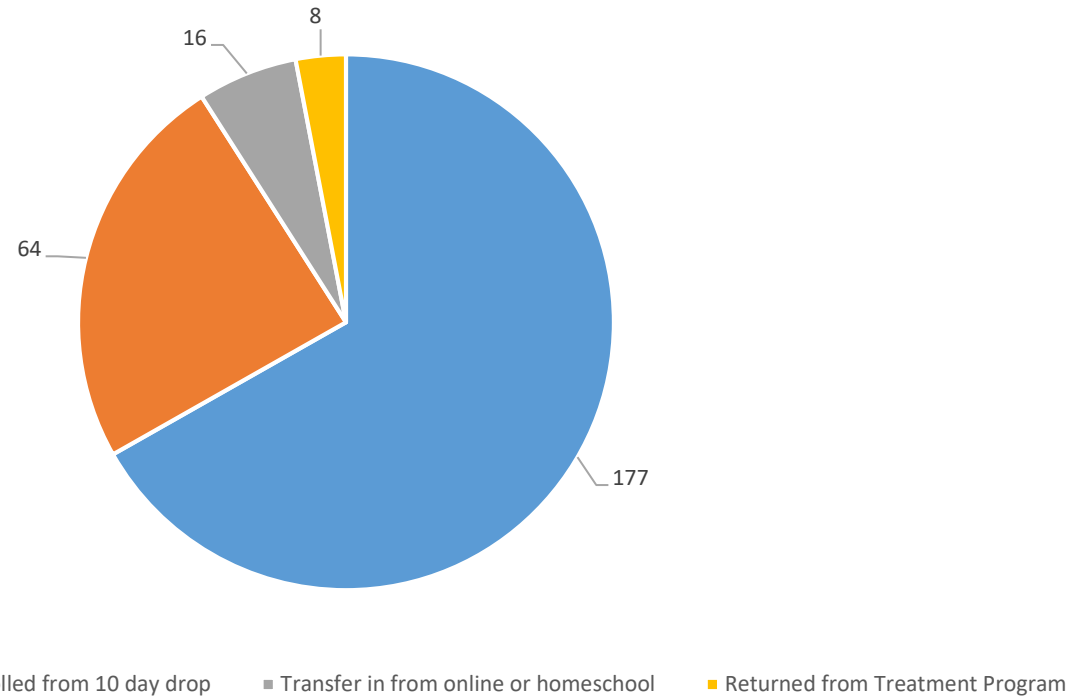


The middle school and high school had 149 students withdraw this school year.

Of the 149 that withdrew:

- 38% moved to another town
- 35% were dropped for lack of attendance
- 12% transferred to another school district
- 7% graduated early
- 2% entered a treatment program
- >1% are now being home schooled
- 2% were expelled

2017-2018 PSD Student Mobility - IN



The Pendleton School District had 265 enrollments this school year.

Of the 265 enrolled:

- 67% moved to Pendleton
- 24% were re-enrolled from a 10 day drop or extended vacation or early graduates re-enrolled
- 6% transferred in from an online school or home schooling program
- 3% returned from a treatment program
