### I. Travel Documents

By now, everyone should have a valid **US passport**. If any participant does not have one, they must apply now. Due to recent presidential executive orders, litigation, and furloughs/terminations across the federal government, the US Passport Agency is experiencing long processing delays.

Please make **four copies of the participant's passport signature and photo pages**: one for the chaperones, one for PHS, one for the participant, and one to keep at home. A copy of the passport will facilitate procuring a new passport if the participant's passport is lost or stolen. It is also a good idea to have a good quality picture of the photo and signature pages on a cell phone. Participants should bring along their **state-issued ID or driver's license**.

If the participant has not yet done so, they should order their **International Student ID Card**. The card costs about \$20 and is recognized around the world and can be used for discounts in many locations. Visit isic.org to order one. If another copy of the enrollment verification I sent is required, let me know. Please be sure to get a plastic card in addition to the one sent to the phone.

**Medical forms and permission forms** will be provided in May. Please make three copies of each form that you have signed after it has been notarized: One for home, one for PHS, and one for the chaperones.

The European Union and Schengen Area will be rolling out the **European Travel Information and Authorisation System** (ETIAS) in April 2025. Similar to the US ESTA program, all non-EU citizens are required to register their travel to Europe with the EU government prior to departure. All participants and chaperones must register, and the cost is about \$10. More information will be provided about that in the coming weeks, as there is still some uncertainty about the rollout.

Note: If you lose your passport shortly before we leave, you will need to schedule an in-person appointment at the passport office in Chicago to have a new one printed. There is no guarantee that an appointment will be available.

## II. Payment Reminder

Your final payment for your trip is due on 01 April 2025. You can pay by check or money order – made out to Pana High School – or you can pay in cash. If you have paid only your \$100 deposit, then you still owe \$2,049.

## III. Insurance Coverage

Our insurance provider has been selected (Bernhard Reiseversicherungen AG) and information about the policy is on the following pages. Parents/guardians, please read the documents carefully and let me know if you have questions. While almost no travel insurance policy covers pre-existing conditions, this policy covers **emergency** treatment for conditions which are <u>stable and well-managed</u> **prior to arrival** in Germany. Participants must bring along any medications and may not travel if their medical conditions are not well-managed before traveling.

All participants and chaperones will be covered under the same policy. It is parents' responsibility to purchase a separate or supplemental policy if they feel that this policy will not meet the participant's needs.

Chaperones will additionally be insured by multiple liability insurance policies.

## IV. **Daily Itinerary**

As a study abroad group – as opposed to the corporate tour groups PHS often travels with – the entire trip is organized on an unpaid, volunteer basis by me and Mareike Müller of the Georg Forster Comprehensive School. As colleagues, we trust each other to create valuable and educationally relevant experiences for each other's students. And that is just what Ms. Müller has done for us.


