Fossil Hill Middle School Teams Qualify for State History Fair: Two Fossil Hill Middle School student teams recently qualified for the State History Fair Competition after winning first and second place at the Regional History Fair at UTA on Saturday, March 3.

Fossil Hill eighth-grade students Lisa Phan, Veronica Semler, Mary Sherrin and Samantha Fisher won first place in the performance category. Fossil Hill seventh-grade students Emily Hughes, Taylor Pasche, Ally Baker and Taylor Bellcoff won second place for their performance.

Both of these teams will be competing in the Texas History Day state competition in Austin, April 28. Winners of the state competition qualify to enter the National History Day fair in Washington, D.C. This is Fossil Hill's second year to participate in the state fair.

Individually, Fossil Hill student Theodore Schmidt placed third in the individual exhibit; Brady Chronister placed third for his historical paper; Kyle Merry placed third in the individual documentary category; Nicholas Goodwin placed sixth for his historical paper; and eighth-graders August Erlingsson, Kelsey Teakell and Danny Bolton place sixth for their group documentary.

Fossil Hill Middle School Student Named Texas Geographic Bee Semifinalist: Fossil Hill Middle School student, Scott Tong, was recently notified by the National Geographic Society that he is one of the semifinalists eligible to compete in the 2007 Texas Geographic Bee. Geographic bees were held in schools with fourth- through eighth-grade students throughout the state to determine each school's geographic bee winner. School-level winners then took a qualifying test, which they submitted to the National Geographic Society. In each of the 50 states and in the territories, the National Geographic Society invited the students with the top 100 scores to compete at the state level.

The 2007 Texas Geographic Bee will be held at the Pat May Center in Bedford on Friday, March 30. The state winner will represent Texas in the national finals at the National Geographic Society headquarters in Washington, D.C., May 22-23. The state winner will receive \$100 and the trip to Washington, D.C. The national winner will receive a \$25,000 college scholarship.
