PBIS: Positive Behavior Intervention Support!

- ◆ PBIS at Evergreen is a huge part of our school culture and provides the structure for building our positive school climate. We try very hard to recognize students who are at school on a regular basis (good attendance), do the right things (good behavior) and are building solid citizenship skills (kindness). Our four school rules; Be safe, Be respectful, Be responsible and Be kind are the basis for our PBIS program. We have an Eagle Reward system in place that recognizes when students go 'above & beyond' our universal expectations. Evergreen also has a PBIS assembly at the end of almost every month to reward students who are consistently doing the right things at school. If your child has not received an office referral, bus citation and no more than 2 redirection room behavior passes they are eligible for the PBIS assembly. We are also reinforcing good attendance with an attendance reward activity. This trimester we are showing a movie with popcorn in our gymnasium. To be eligible for this activity a student cannot have missed more than 3 days in the first trimester. I understand that some students have "had" to miss school for very legitimate reasons. The requirements for the activity are very standard. A student with more than 3 absences for any reason is no longer eligible for the movie. I have had to hold my daughter out of more than one of our attendance reward activities over the past five years, so I know it is difficult as a parent to explain this to your child.

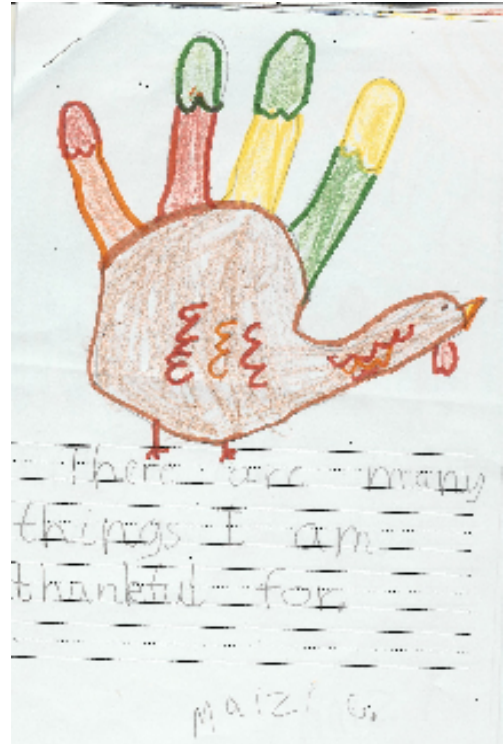
December = winter weather!

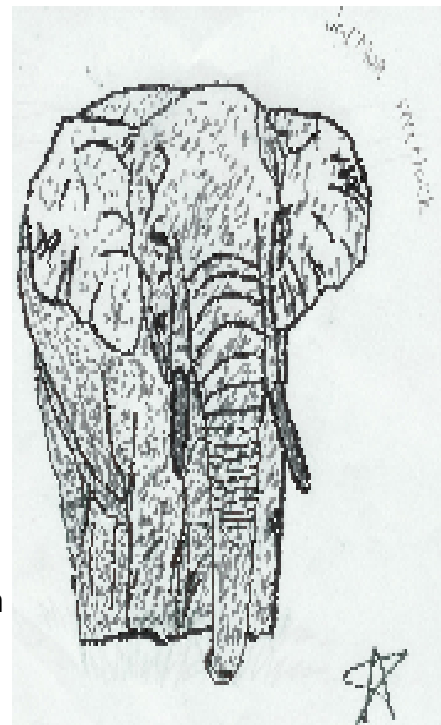

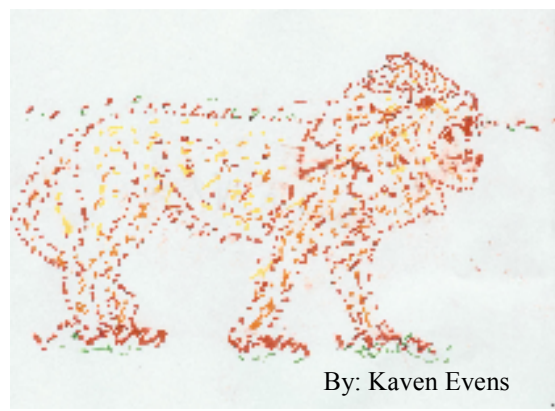

Sponsored by the State Treasurer and the Oregon College Savings Plan, the program aims to promote literacy and financial education among K-5 elementary students in Oregon. In four years, 7500 students have participated statewide and almost \$92,000 in Oregon College Savings Plan



scholarships has been awarded.

One component of this program is encouraging kids to read or be read to, and the books should relate to money and finances. Students must read at least 3 books from the recommended reading list, and they can enter the drawing for a college savings plan scholarship up to 10 times. They can only win 1 scholarship each year.

Children must complete the program by March 18, 2011 to be entered into the scholarship drawing.

In the event of adverse weather conditions parents are advised to tune in to Radio Stations KRWQ, KAJQ, KLDR, KBOY and TV Stations KOBI (5), KDRV (12), KTVL (10) or the 3 Rivers School District Web Page for information on school bus schedules.

Sometimes weather conditions leave some roads blocked or unsafe to travel but school is still being held. Under these circumstances "straight line routes" will be run. This is the information you will get on the web page or radio/TV stations.

When straight line routes are run the roads affected are listed below.

If you live on one of the roads the buses cannot travel, you may bring your student to the nearest intersection of the main road traveled. This will also be the stop for the afternoon drop off.
