Viking Theater Co. was a one week summer school class in which the students put on a full scaled performance. The students were engaged in all of the components of putting on a play; design of set and painting, making costumes, figuring out on-stage movement, rehearsing lines and finally putting on a performance to a live audience. The <u>Trial of Goldilocks</u> was a huge success with our students performing to all of the summer school students in addition to family and friends. There were many laughs with this fractured fairy tale. We had 17 students ranging from incoming 3rd grade-7th grade take part in the Viking Theater Co.'s inaugural show.

Outdoor Adventures Class

This summer, we switched up our outdoors class to include more unique experiences that some students might not have had before. One highlight was a partnership with Wild River Outfitters in Grantsburg. Each week we took our group of students canoeing down the St. Croix River. Students loved this experience with getting to learn about paddling on the water. At one of the pit stops, students found a crayfish location and figured out creative ways to catch them without hurting themselves or the fish. They also got to go for a bike ride on the Gandy Dancer trail, go hiking/geocaching on the Ice Age Trail and they topped their week off with a visit to Shell Lake beach to go swimming.
