Our Curriculum and Instruction team is actively engaged in summer work. During this time, we focus on revising curriculum documents by reviewing lessons, assessments, and the student supports we offer to teachers.

Summer is also a peak period for professional learning. As we enter the third year of curriculum implementation, our focus is on enhancing student engagement strategies, refining student supports, and integrating technology to enrich instruction.

We value the insights of teachers and instructional leaders and use input to make meaningful adaptations. Our goal is to ensure that all staff are equipped with the tools and skills necessary for success.

Counseling

Leadership Development & School Improvement

Student-Centered Coaching Training

On June 9th and 10th, Instructional coaches received the first of 4 two-day training sessions on a new coaching model. Diane Sweeney's Student-Centered Coaching Model places student learning outcomes at the heart of the coaching process. It emphasizes a collaborative, non-evaluative partnership between teachers and coaches, focusing on instructional strategies that directly impact student achievement. The model is data-driven, using formative assessments to inform instruction and guide decision-making. Coaching is organized into structured 4–6 week cycles aligned with specific student learning goals. Rather than focusing on teacher deficiencies, the approach centers on co-planning and co-teaching to meet clearly defined student learning targets.
