
I have also been able to get into the classroom and do 96 walkthroughs, since the semester started.



We are very happy that we were able to test 89% of those students that we needed to progress monitor. Those students that made gains on their ISIP scores received a gift card. I am also very excited to say that 17% of the students progress monitored moved into Tier 1. We met the goal of our action plan in 1 month. I am hoping the students continue their upward progress. I have asked teachers to inform students that if they maintain their Tier 1 status, increase a Tier or improve by 150 points they can go on an incentives trip on May 17th
