Computer applications help students acquire knowledge of and experience in software such as Google Docs, Sheets, Slides, and Drawing. They cover other topics such as electronic mail, desktop publishing, and digital media health all while thinking about and creating visuals for life after school at BHS.

Digital Media is a class offered to Juniors and Seniors that gives them the skills to support and enhance their learning about digital media technology. We cover the use of digital imagery, presentation tools, project planning, copyright, and creating stories/ capturing history through digital media.

Entrepreneurship is a course that acquaints students with the knowledge and skills necessary to start up and operate their own businesses. They cover topics such as human relations and psychology, financial planning, communication, marketing, and prototyping. The students take a product from idea to sales over the course of the semester.


Biology classes are spending the remainder of the semester focusing on the Kingdoms of Life, starting with the invisible world of microorganisms. Groups of students made predictions about the "dirtiest" and "cleanest" areas of the high school, then tested their guesses by sampling areas around BHS and inoculating petri dishes to compare bacteria abundance.



Wildlife Biology students (among other classes) had the opportunity to attend 2 wildlife-related field trips: On February 28th over 80 students traveled to West Glacier for a career day with staff from Glacier National Park. On March 14th BHS was invited to participate in the 2023 Forum on Indigenous Leadership in Honoring and Caring for the Crown of the Continent Ecosystem.



Earth Science classes are finishing up poster presentations on bodies of water around the Blackfeet Reservation. After Spring Break they will host 2nd and 3rd grade BPS students and share these posters, along with other interactive STEM-related activities.

PRE-ACT & ACT assessments

Getting back into the swing of assessments after the pandemic restrictions has BHS seeing our numbers on the rise. There were 80 sophomores who took the Pre-ACT/make up Pre-ACT and 36 who took the ACT. We have a make-up day scheduled for April 11. We were

able to shut down classrooms for sophomores and juniors to test and teachers to proctor from 8-12 on two different days. Breakfast, snacks and lunch were served. For the ACT assessment we had a few glitches with technology as we are using Chromebooks instead of paper/pencil. However, we figured it out and was able to test. Due to field trips, we had a smaller number, we are expecting larger group at the makeup day.
