

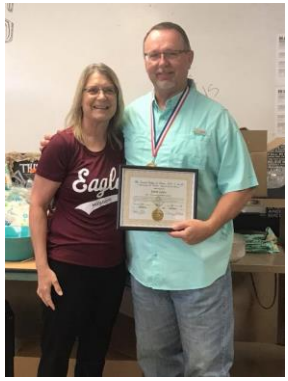
HJHS EAGLES

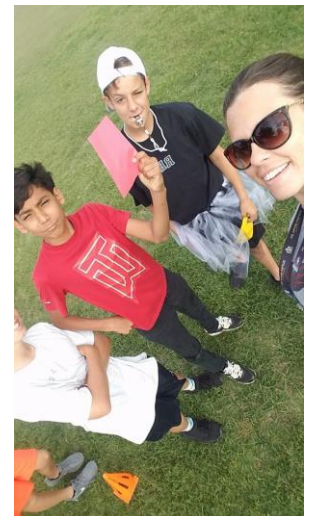
