

 - Redevelop




Options for Consideration within District

- 1. Potential location for <u>Diamondhead Education Center</u> programs and staff if the building is leased or sold.
- Potential location for <u>Burnsville Alternative High School</u> (BAHS) to be located if current location is repurposed.
- Potential location for <u>Burnsville Eagan Savage Transition</u> (BEST) if the River Ridge Building is leased or sold.
- 4. Facilities utilization is complex and interdependent on other programs within our district.



Facilities Decision Making Timeline





Current Program Occupancy Needs for Diamondhead Education Center - programs/staff members if the building is leased/sold

- Enrollment Center: 2 offices, 8 workspaces, welcoming area
- ECSE: 12 classrooms, 2 clerical, cafeteria, 30+ workspaces, staff cafeteria, 1 workroom
- Community Education:18+ classrooms, 3 gyms, 2 studios, 6 offices, workroom, 5 clerical, Atrium meeting space
- Diamondhead Clinic/Park Nicollet: offices for nurse, doctor, waiting room, exam rooms
- Senior Center: 1 office, 3 breakout areas, adult restrooms, kitchen, storage, front desk
- ABE: 1 clerical, 1 office, 9+ classrooms, adult restrooms bathrooms, accessible, storage
- Technology: 1 office and 5 workspaces, storage
- Food Service: 1 office, 1 clerical, 3 workspaces
- Adult Flexible Learning Space/Boardroom: Burnsville, Eagan, Savage Meeting Rooms, C-Wing (4 classrooms)
- Accounting: 8 clerical, 1 office, fileroom
- Operations: 1 clerical, 2 offices, OSHA files
- Communications: 2 office spaces
- Student Support: 2 clerical, 4 supervisors, 3 workspaces
- SISA: 2 clerical, 3 offices, 12 office space, 3 large storage areas, workroom
- Human Resources: 4 workspaces, conference room
- Central Office: 2 clerical, 6 offices, storage room, workroom, meeting rooms
- Additional Spaces: reception, mailroom, SISA workroom



Implications for Consideration

(Not a comprehensive list)

- Separation of administrative services from a central location
- Need for meeting spaces for large groups professional development, School Board meetings, and community events
- Retrofitting student space, including bathrooms, in open school buildings to adult space
- Cost for returning buildings to student use when needed
- Need for financial cost benefit analysis
- Estimates at this time are between \$2 million to \$2.5 million for moving costs and retrofitting

4 bathrooms, public transportation bus line

 - b. Are there other community stakeholders interested in collaborating to form solutions?




Community Partnerships' Role
