Overview

- 5/15 - The Senior Art Show took place in the high school art gallery. As always, the artwork was excellent and artists had the opportunity to speak with others about their art. Jenny Zang's art was selected for the annual District art purchase.
- 5/16 - Link Crew Development Day - Twenty six Link Crew Leaders for the 2019-20 school year met for our annual May Development day. This day is important because it helps establish our program expectations and tone for the upcoming year. The leaders spent time participating in some of the activities that they will lead at orientation. This helps them become familiar with the activities and helps them understand the importance of their role as leaders. The leaders also set up some committees to design their leaders shirts and compile the list of "What Every Freshman Should Know" that will be used with their groups at orientation. It was a great way to start off the process for next year.
