Expiring Waivers

All waivers, other than those listed below, are fine and there are no legal comments.

Flexible Schedule

Ark. Code Ann. § 6-16-102

Legal Comments: Applicant does not need a waiver of Ark. Code Ann. § 6-16-102(a)(5), which only pertains to elementary schools.

Applicant Response: This waiver was initially requested in order to allow flexible scheduling to accommodate students that wanted to participate in internships and apprenticeships, student remediation, as well as common planning time for teachers for project integration and professional development opportunities such as teacher externships. MHHSCA is still requesting the flexible schedule waiver option in order to continue these best practices for student achievement.

Legal Comments: Applicant does not need a waiver of Ark. Code Ann. § 6-16-102(a)(5), which only pertains to elementary schools. Ark. Code Ann. § 6-18-210 has been repealed, therefore no waiver is necessary. Applicant has cited to an outdated version of the Standards for Accreditation. The new Standards for Accreditation (effective July 1, 2018) does not have a Standard 10.01.4 or 14.03. Applicant should review the new Standards to determine which, if any, waivers it needs.

Curriculum

1-A.2, Standards

Legal Comments: The new Standards for Accreditation allow credit to be given to a student for a course that meets for a minimum of 120 clock hours *unless* the school district awards credits based on subject matter competency in compliance with the district's approved plan under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-15-216. Does the Applicant need a waiver because the Applicant does not have an approved plan for providing competency based credit, or because the Applicant is not providing competency based credit or 120 clock hour credit?

Applicant Response: This waiver has been requested to allow students to receive credit only (indicated with a CR or NC) on their transcript for work-based learning opportunities such as internships and apprenticeships. In the application, clarification is provided that addresses how the applicant meets or exceeds the 120 clock hour credit.

Legal Comments: Applicant did not answer the question from Legal. The new Standards for Accreditation allow credit to be given to a student for a course that meets for a minimum of 120 clock hours *unless* the school district awards credits based on subject matter competency in compliance with the district's approved plan under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-15-216. Does the Applicant need a waiver because the Applicant does not have an approved plan for providing competency based credit, or because the Applicant is not providing competency based credit?

Teacher Licensure

ADE Rules Governing Educator Licensure

Legal Comments: Does the Applicant have licensed teachers teaching outside of their licensure area? If yes, only a waiver of Section 7 is needed. If no, no waiver of these Rules is needed. There is no section 9.01 of these Rules.

Applicant Response: This waiver was requested to allow MHHSCA get the right teacher for the position. For example, we have had teachers elementary certified to teach the internship program, apprenticeship program, and Keystone or Capstone in the past. Teachers were then asked to attend training to receive the ACE/CTE endorsement for those classes. Also, this waiver has allowed MHHSCA to utilize community partners who are experts in their fields as instructors in various courses. **Legal Comments:** Does the Applicant have licensed teachers teaching outside of their licensure area? If yes, only a waiver of Section 7 is needed. If no, no waiver of these Rules is needed.
