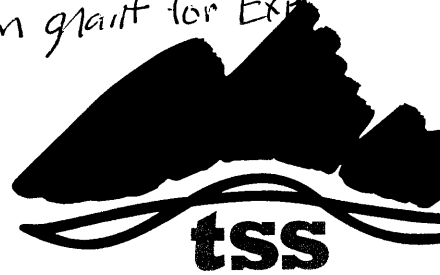

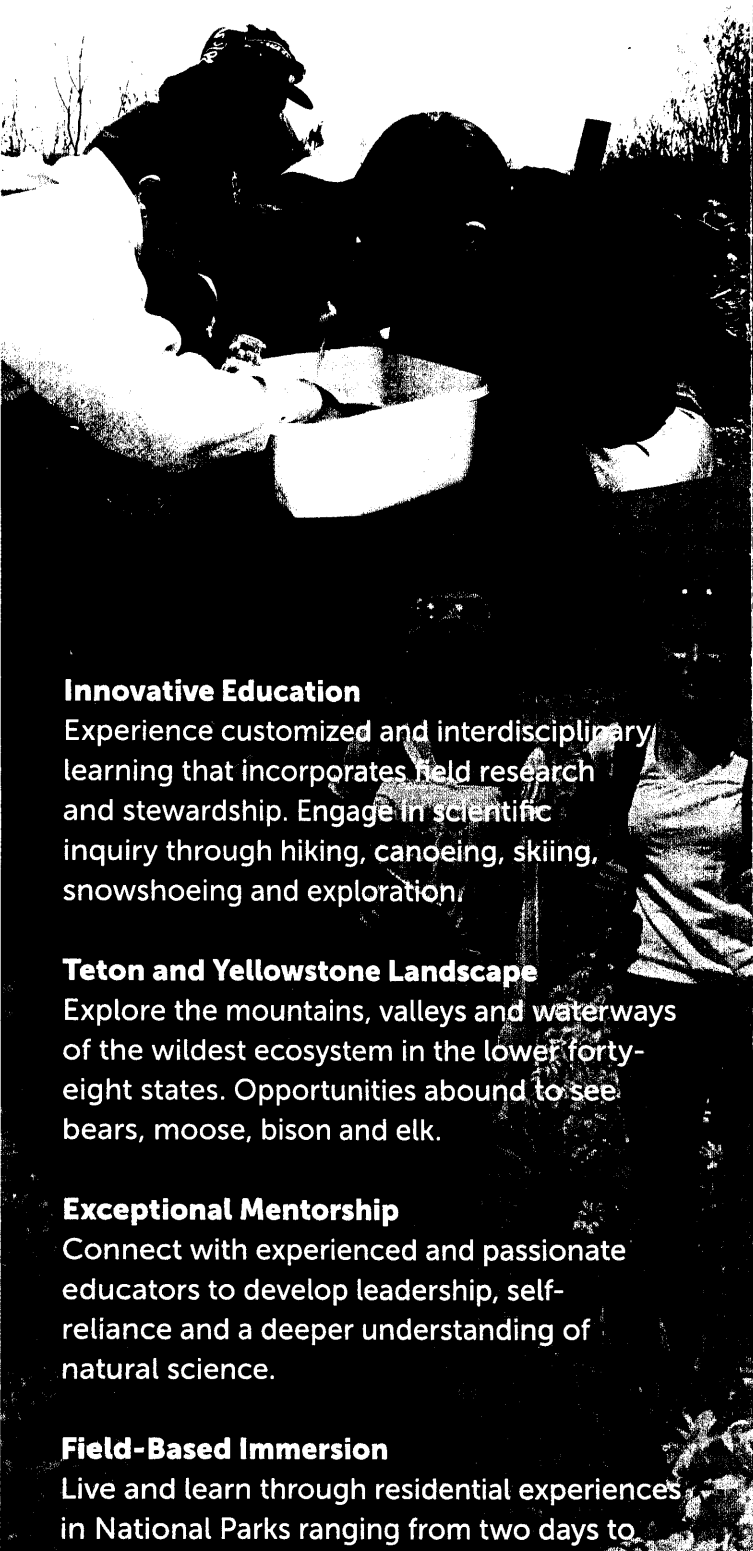

We fully immerse visiting school groups in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem to develop scientific literacy, connect to place and cultivate leadership skills.

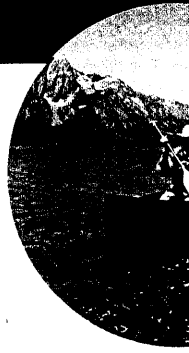
Our staff works with teachers and administrators to create custom programs that meet standards-based educational goals. Our two campuses provide comfortable housing, delicious food and all the equipment necessary for an extraordinary educational experience.



ADULT AND FAMILY

We offer adult and family programs that educate, provide rich experiences and create quality family time while exploring the beauty of Jackson Hole.

Our college programs give students hands-on, field experience to enhance and expand classroom course work. We lead custom ecology, sustainability and education courses to take campus-based learning into the field.



SUMMER CAMPS

We offer fun and engaging nature-based science adventures for children in elementary, middle and high school. Program lengths vary, from day-long to extended overnight programs for different aged youth.

Our day programs run throughout the summer for kids entering kindergarten through 9th grade. Campers explore the forests, waterways and mountains as they learn, make new friends and have fun.

We offer longer, overnight programs of 10 to 27 days for middle school and high school students. These adventures include hiking, canoeing, camping and backpacking in Grand Teton and Yellowstone National Parks. Campers will make new friends, experience personal growth and better understand the process of science.
