
## Our Demographics

- 56% of students who scored in Need Support Category in reading and science were students with disabilities or Characteristics of Dyslexia.

### ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE: IVY HILL OVERVIEW OF CHANGES IN PROFICIENCY LEVELS

Ivy Hill's evaluation was limited to a **singular grade level—3rd grade**—with a cohort of 37 students, all of whom were economically disadvantaged and African American. Given the small sample size, the Value Added Score may have been disproportionately influenced by the performance of a single student.

Notably, 42% of schools statewide experienced a decline in reading scores.

These 3<sup>rd</sup> grades students begin their education during the pandemic and are undeniably contending with the repercussions of disrupted learning, particularly evident in reading proficiency.

### ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE:

#### Reading: -9%

The decline in reading scores indicate challenges and issues within the reading curriculum Wit and Wisdom, struggling teacher, and a high need population. 27% of the students scoring in the INS were students with disabilities and Characteristics of Dyslexia.

#### **Science: -14%**

Similar to reading, the negative percentage in science indicates challenges with curriculum alignment, struggling teachers; poor readers. 27% of the students scoring in the INS were students with disabilities and Characteristics of Dyslexia.

While the school experienced a decrease in proficiency in reading and science, it saw an increase in math scores for the second consecutive year and in English by 15%.



# ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE: OVERVIEW SUMMARY

#### Reading: 3%

Students reading skills improved resulting in a 3% increase in reading proficiency

Science: -2%

The negative change of -2% in science proficiency indicates a decline in students' performance in this subject. Possible factors contributing to this decline could include changes in curriculum, teaching methods, or external factors affecting science education. Investigating the specific areas within the science curriculum that saw a decrease may help in implementing targeted improvements.

#### **Math: 2%**

Student's mathematical skills improved resulting in a 2% increase in math proficiency

#### English: 13%

There was a substantial positive increase in English proficiency of 13% In summary, Nichols Intermediate experienced positive changes in reading, math, and English proficiency levels, with a slight decline in science proficiency from 2022 to 2023.

# A REDUCTION IN THE PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS SCORING IN THE LOWEST CATEGORY IN READING

- After our inaugural year, 83% of our students fell into the Need Support category as our baseline data in 2019.
- From 2023 to 2023, the percentage of students scoring in the Need Support Category for reading decreased from 64.98 to 60.58.
- Between 2019 and 2023, the number of students reading in the lowest category has diminished by 23%.
