In order to move to the minimum graduation plan, a student must meet the criteria created by Texas Education Code §28.025 and Denton ISD Procedures for Minimum Plan Assignment. Some of the possible consequences of moving to the minimum plan are listed below and both student and parent must acknowledge that these consequences have been explained and are understood. Application for assignment is not a guarantee that the student will graduate. Student is responsible for satisfactory completion of all coursework and testing requirements described in Denton ISD policy and state rules governing minimum plan graduation.

I understand that I am requesting to graduate on the State of Texas High School Minimum Plan. In doing so, I acknowledge that :

- I understand that there are course requirements for the minimum plan that are not a part of the Recommended High School Plan for graduation.
- I may be excluded from some college programs, scholarships, and/or grant opportunities.
- I have not completed a college preparatory plan which may result in the need for remediation classes at the college level.
- I may not be admitted to a 4 year college/university due to failure to meet admissions requirements unless I qualify with college readiness standards on ACT or SAT testing.
- I have been counseled about my options for post-secondary education and/or training, and I have completed a graduation course work plan with my counselor.
- Parent and student acknowledge by signatures below that they have received and read the written notice from the district explain the benefits of the Recommended High School Plan (RHSP).

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HB 3826 required that all students who graduate from a public or accredited private high school in Texas must graduate under the recommended or advanced plan to qualify for admission to a public 4 year education institution in Texas, or qualify with college readiness standards on ACT or SAT testing. This requirement began with college admissions for 2008-09 year.
