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Operational Impact

The selection process:

Elementary: A "Showcase" was conducted in February whereby each publisher came to Denton ISD and was able to showcase their products for our teachers. This allowed teachers to learn about the various features of each offering directly from the publishers. Additionally, questions were resolved quickly and adequately. Next, a pamphlet review was conducted and all attendees were surveyed. Finally, an on-line survey was conducted for all teachers that were not in attendance.

Secondary: A Teacher Textbook Selection Team consisted of one representative from each grade level from each middle school. They worked as a sixth grade team, seventh grade team, and an eighth grade team to study the instructional material choices. A teacher survey was conducted and the final choices were made. The in-class novel titles were made after an exhaustive study by the teacher selection team. The titles chosen best match our current units, have high student interest levels, and include various Lexile (readability) levels.

<u>Results</u>

These new resources will replace instructional materials that have been in place for approximately 10-12 years. The materials will be a substantial improvement over the aged materials teachers have been using for implementing writing, language arts, reading, and handwriting.

Other Options

Each of the resources were evaluated against competing resources in the various categories and were judged to be the superior choice for our students. Typically, the alternate choices did not provide the extensive instructional capacity when compared to the recommendations above or were more expensive.
