Mentors are matched with a child to join for lunch at school two to four times a month. They share a meal and spend the rest of recess playing games, talking, reading, etc.

- Background check
- Interview
- Mentee parent approval
- Match

# Does this program really work?

# Children in mentoring programs are...

- 46% less likely to begin using illegal drugs
- 27% less likely to begin using alcohol
- 52% less likely to skip school
